This summer we have been working on **some projects around the parish** (as we often do varied projects each summer). Among the jobs this year include patching and repairs on our parking lot and replacing the roof on the cry room (as well as replacing some ceiling tiles in cry room and other areas). We're in the midst of converting the lighting in the school to LED (which we did in church a couple of years ago). This also involves replacing some insulation in the ceiling and many of the ceiling tiles in the school. We also are sprucing up the outside of some buildings by power-washing and painting, and we are in midst of doing some sealing of walls that are below grade in the parish hall, school and parish house. This is a result of your generosity to the parish and we strive to be good stewards of your offerings to the parish. Thank you so much.

## Notes from Deacon Denny

As we look forward to beginning a new school year, a new time of growing, we conclude our "summer notes" as we continue on our path toward Sainthood. While we look at new challenges and new adventures in learning with the uncertainty of what is to come, we join the poets, the discerners and the lessons from the lives of the Saints in renewing our resolve to keep building our faith in the face of the unknown. It's an age old pause to reflect. We are continually called to define our own unique spirituality.

However, according to recent authors, any true spirituality today must consider being a part of a collective spirituality. *The New Spiritual Exercises: In the Spirit of Pierre Teilhard de Chardin* by Louis M. Savary reads, "spirituality must include awareness of and cooperation with God's unfinished project. That is, (what we are becoming). Each person has work to do as part of this grand project. Your work is connected to the efforts of all other persons, so it is part of your work to support and encourage others, since the success of your part of the great project often depends on the success of their parts. For Teilhard, you are not the center of your life purpose. The Christ Project is."

"In the fundamental structure of the Hebrew Scriptures and Hebrew spirituality is a focus on the not-yet. For Adam, for Noah, for Abraham, for Moses, God is always out ahead, making promises that have yet to happen, and calling for faith that those promises will be fulfilled in some evolutionary future. Jesus, too, lived out this same "not-yet" spirituality during his time on Earth."

"Relationships always bring complexity. You learn who you truly are by making your life more complex. And with complexity, as you welcome it, comes consciousness—among other things, a growing consciousness of your true identity and your capacities, more of your wholeness." *The Liturgy of the Hours on "Wisdom"* shares, "Wisdom makes gain in one's heart when we balance our knowledge and our faith, as well as, our powers of reason with faith."

Wisdom grows when we recognize God's Presence and His love for us, understanding a spiritual transcendent awareness of a reality beyond our physical senses. Wisdom is not found in man's laws or admonitions. Wisdom inspires us to utilize our gifts in love for the benefit of others and developing common good.


