

- **Sponsor Certificates:** May be obtained by registered, practicing members of our parish who have received the three sacraments of initiation: Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist (and, if Married, were married in the church).

Greetings of Peace as we enter into the Season of Summer!

Recently we were asked by Bishop Perez to look at our posture at mass: when we stand, sit, kneel, pray together, and pray "on our own."

This weekend, as we celebrate the Body and Blood of Christ, we have an opportunity to reflect on "what we do," "how we do it," and "why we do it" at mass - particularly the Communion Procession and our reception of Holy Communion.



The U.S. Bishops tell us the **Communion Procession** is a sign that we are a pilgrim Church on our way to the Heavenly Jerusalem. When we move in procession, particularly the procession to Communion, we are a sign, a symbol, that we are "on the way."

As we process and receive the Eucharist, we join in the Communion Song (or Communion Chant), in which we praise Christ, express our belief in him, and our desire to share his life. All are called to unite our voices, minds, and hearts by singing the song. For some, the singing of the Communion Song can be seen as an intrusion on their own "private" prayer. However, the Bishops remind us, all are called to participate in the Communion Song. "**Now is the time to process and sing together.**" The song is our prayer. We are united in posture, gesture, words, song, and movement! There is a time for our personal prayer or thanksgiving after Communion.



Speaking of "Song" and music, we have begun the search process for a Parish Director of Music. In the interim, we are pleased to announce that Mrs. Jodie Ricci will lead us in music at most of our weekend masses. Jodie has helped here in the past and we are grateful for her talent, faith, and generous spirit. Jodie's presence and musical gifts will help us as we pray and worship in song as a faith community. We look forward to having you with us, Jodie, and thank you!

Moreover, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has determined that the normative posture for receiving Communion is standing, and that the faithful should bow before they receive the Eucharist. This is the appropriate act of reverence. No other gesture is necessary. These norms may require some adjustment on the part of those who have been used to other practices; however the significance of unity in posture and gesture as a symbol of our unity as members of the one body of Christ should be the governing factor in our own actions.

According to the Bishops, those who receive Communion are encouraged to receive in the hand (however, it is an individual's option if they choose to receive on the tongue). The Bishops teach that when Communion is received in the hand, the hands should, first of all, be clean. The communicant should place one hand over the other, facing up. The host will then be laid in the palm of the hand by the communion minister as they proclaim, "The Body of Christ." The one receiving communion bows, responds, "Amen," and picks up the host and takes it to their mouth. *It is not appropriate to reach out with the fingers and take the host from the* person distributing.

When one receives from the chalice, the Communicant again responds, "Amen" when they are offered the Blood of Christ. Then they "take and drink" from the cup. The Bishops remind us that it is never permissible for a person to dip the host he or she has received into the chalice. If, for some reason, the communicant is not able (or willing) to drink from the cup then that person should receive under the form of bread and not from the cup. Perhaps there are some who cannot receive the consecrated bread. Remember, the cup is also the true and real presence of Christ in Holy Communion.

As a community of faith, we are the living - breathing Body of Christ. Let us be grateful for the nourishment we receive in the Eucharist, and seek to become more like him on whom we feed and drink. May our Unity and Reverence at mass help us as we strive to live up to our calling. Amen!


