

Greetings of Peace,

We are now in the **Season of Autumn!** Fall began at 4:58 AM on Monday September 23. Even though the weather has been warm, it will be "taking a turn" in the coming weeks and months. Let us thank God for the changing of the times and seasons!



Did you know the autumnal equinox is the time when day and night are roughly equal in length? During the equinox, the Sun "crosses" the so called "celestial equator," an imaginary extension of Earth's equator into space. The equinox happens when the Sun's center passes through this line.

Now some bad news. Once we begin Fall, the sun rises later, and night comes sooner. This continues for about 3 months until the December or Winter Solstice (at 11:19 PM on December 21), after which the days grow longer and nights shorter! Yea!

Many people look forward to the "fall colors" (fall foliage). It is interesting that the changing of colors is not due to "weather conditions." Leaves change color because of the lessening amount of daylight which affects photosynthesis.

Fall also brings wonderful holidays like Halloween and Thanksgiving.

And, in about a month, we will have the end of Daylight Savings Time (DST) when we "spin our clocks backwards," gain an hour's sleep, and "Fall back. (I'd prefer to never change our clocks - neither in the spring nor in the fall. Oh well!) *I believe DST ends at 2:00 AM on Sunday November 3.* 

Last Saturday, September 21, we had our **Annual Parish Raffle** at our **"End of Summer Cook Out."** It was a great event with over 200 people participating - and "a good time was had by all!"

## Mass Moments and their Meanings

Greeting

*Priest:* "The Lord be with you" People: "And with your spirit."



This is no ordinary greeting, like "Good Morning" to which we would respond" Good Morning" back.

These words from the Bible echo back in time to what important people of God heard. Moses, Isaac, Jacob, Joshua, King David, and the Blessed Virgin Mary all heard the words "The Lord is with you" either from God directly or from an angel when they were asked to perform

superhuman tasks. None of them felt worthy to be called

and these words bolstered their confidence.

Often we need to be reminded that God is with us. This is especially true when we are experiencing trials, sorrow, discouragement or struggles in our lives. It is important to hear these words especially if we are not feeling God's presence. We need to be reminded that He is always with

When we say "and with your spirit" to the priest, we are acknowledging the Holy Spirit's unique role in the mass by virtue of his ordination. He needs to be finely tuned to perform his sacred duties well.

The Confiteor: " I Confess..."

St. James reminded early Christians to confess their sins to one another because of the social effects of sin. Sin affects our relationship with God and with one another.

We humbly prepare and purify ourselves to be ready to receive Christ later in the mass and ask others to pray for us. This is not just a simple apology to God, but a heartfelt sorrow.

Four areas of sin:

"In my thoughts" ex. anger, lust, anxiety.

"In my words" ex. gossip, slander, insults, boastfulness.
"In what I have done" ex. sins against 10 Commandments.

"In what I have failed to do" ex. Not doing what we know to be right.

We hope many will be able to volunteer and be a special part of our annual Parish Service Day!


<u>PSR Parent Newsletter</u>


## Fatima Rosary
