

Sponsor Certificates: May be obtained by registered, practicing members of our parish who have received the three sacraments of initiation: Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist (and, if Married, were married the church). Please contact the Parish office.

Wednesdays at 7:00 PM (September thru May).

From the Pastor

Greetings of Peace.

As we enter into November we discover the days are colder and the nights are longer - and Saturday night, No-

vember 3, we changed our clocks from Daylight Savings to "Standard" Time.



This weekend, on Saturday Novem-

ber 3 at our 4:30 PM mass, we remember those whose funerals we celebrated at St. Joan of Arc over the past year. The faithful departed are named in a Litany and the families of those who have lost loved ones are invited to join us at mass. This is a beautiful reminder that we are all on our pilgrim journey to the Kingdom of God - and we rejoice with all the Saints who have received the gift of union with God in heaven. We believe our departed loved ones are among the saints in the halls of heaven. Amen!

Each November our parish "Book of Remembrance" is placed in our Gathering Area. Parishioners are invited to enter the names of family members and loved ones who have died. By entering them in the Book of Remembrance we ask our parish family to remember them and to keep them in our prayers. We are God's people - on our journey of faith - trusting in the promise of resurrection. Where our loved ones have gone, we hope to follow!

Please be reminded: Our parish weekend mass schedule will be adjusted beginning in December:

- -- Saturday mass will continue to be celebrated at 4:30 PM
- -- Sunday masses will be 9:00 AM and 11:00 AM.

St. Joan of Arc has been a "one priest" parish for the past 5-1/2 years during which we maintained four (4) weekend masses, since I have been able to obtain priests to assist with masses.

However, the availability of priests to offer help - especially regularly - has been dwindling quickly. Those priests who may be available to help are often needed at other churches whose priest(s) may be away, on a leave of absence, or other reasons.

Other "one priest" parishes in our area have three (3) weekend masses similar to our new schedule.

Did you know last weekend Holy Angels announced they lost both of their priests (and they are right "down the road"). They are wondering what will happen at Holy Angels.

How many masses should a parish have on a weekend? Ideally, one. The community gathers together as one family to give praise and worship to God. Since most churches are not big enough to accommodate the entire parish at once, parishes have more than one mass - usually determined by the size of the church and also providing some convenience.

I really appreciate your support and your understanding on our mass schedule change. As we enter November and the days grow shorter, may our love and faith increase! Have a great week.

Every week in our bulletin, there is a Mass on Sunday for the people of the parish. I just recently noticed it in another church as well. Is it to fill in an intention, or is someone requesting it every week?

The pastor of a parish is charged with the well-being of the community. There are many aspects of this task, including the physical, spiritual and social concerns of maintaining and building a community of faith. Each week, by church law, the pastor offers Mass on Sunday for the people of the parish. It is a tangible and practical way that the pastor prays for those entrusted to his care. No one requests it, nor is it offered only when there is an open intention. In fact, the pastor may not accept a stipend for it.

The spiritual needs of the people are the primary concern of the pastor. His prayer for them is the first way he cares for them. You may also see Mass intentions for those listed in a memorial, or deceased members of the parish, or past members of a group or organization. These too are ways the pastor remembers the needs of all the members of his parish, asking the Lord to bless and protect them, bringing us all to eternal life.

Notes from Deacon Denny

Recent "Notes" raised two questions; What does it mean to rest in God? And is it just through prayer that we find such rest?

"..human beings are created for joy, not pain and suffering. It is our fallen state that subtracted joy from our hearts, plunging us into pain, sorrow, insecurity, fear, and angst It is illusory,.. to try to overcome these problems by focusing exclusively on pursuits that are ephemeral. These pursuits cannot give real rest to the human soul. "The only path to real joy is through the reestablishment of our absolute relationship with God, with a direct experiential connection with the Divine, the presence of God in our hearts. Our hearts then become receptive chalices that accept the fruits of the Holy Spirit, this absolute and inexpressible joy that springs from within us as we strive to abide by God's commandments, that is, to love God and, by extension, every other human being. It is our very nature which dictates that we cannot attain real ontological joy outside of God.""..... "" A person feels completely rested in God's Presence."(But how do we find that peace) ... it is not going to happen automatically. We will have to work for it and undergo real metanoia, a radical change of our thinking and feeling.""..... 'lovers of God.'....are people who have come to know the true nature of God in His total and unconditional love for all people and all creation....they realize that the aim of life is to become one with God. They have come to know God experientially." "Inner River: A Pilgrimage to the Heart of Christian Spirituality" by Kyriacos C. Markides.

So how do we grow our relationship with God? Ignatius would suggest seeing God in all things and through discerning prayer. So, how do we seek God? So, how do we pray? Romans 8:26- "The Spirit helps us in our weakness, for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but the Spirit himself makes intercession for us with groanings that cannot be expressed in speech."
