

Greetings of Peace.

This weekend we offer our annual **Finance Report at all of our weekend masses**. Thank you for your generous support of our parish and its ministries. For the last four (4) months, we have been very blessed to have Mrs.

Jodie Ricci here at St. Joan of Arc to lead us in music at most of our weekend masses (while we have been looking for a parish Music Director). We are grateful for Jodie's talent, faith, enthusiasm, and generous spirit she has shared with us. Jodie's presence and musical gifts have helped us to pray and worship as a faith

community and her joyous spirit is contagious. Because of her commitments at her school and family, after this weekend (October 5-6), Jodie will need to "back off" and so she will no longer to be able to help us as regularly on weekends. Having her as a "regular" for these past several months has certainly been a blessing for us at St. Joan of Arc. THANK YOU so much, Mrs. Jodie Ricci. We have been blessed by your presence. (Jodie shared with me that she will help "as she is able" - and that is wonderful news.)

Lastly, I thought I'd take this chance to remind us of Bishop Perez' directive about our **posture** at mass.

Since Easter we have been instructed to **remain standing after the Lamb of God, throughout the distribution and reception of Holy Communion and the singing of the Communion Hymn.** Then, **once the distribution of Holy Communion has been completed the faithful may sit or kneel for private prayer.** (However, it is understood that individual members of the faithful may not be able to stand or kneel for a period of time because of health reasons or physical limitations. Of course, they may do what is best for themselves and their circumstances.)

For the most part, we have done pretty well with this instruction. Nicely done!

During mass we assume different postures - standing, kneeling, sitting - and we make a variety of gestures. These postures and gestures are not merely ceremonial. They have profound meaning. The Church sees in these common postures and gestures both a symbol of the unity of those who have come together to worship and also a means of fostering that unity.



We are not free to change these postures to suit our own individual piety, for the Church makes it clear that our unity of posture and gesture is an expression that we are indeed the one Body of Christ, united in body, mind, spirit, and voice.

## Mass Moments and their Meanings The Liturgy of the Word

#### The First Reading:



The First Reading is usually from the Old Testament, except during Easter season, when it is from the Acts of the Apostles. The more one understands the Old Testament story of Israel, the more one will understand the fulfillment of God's promises in the New Testament. All scripture is the inspired word of God communicated through the words of men.

When the Lector says "the Word of the Lord" at the end of the reading it should signal us like a trumpet call and when we respond with "Thanks be to God" we are expressing our amazement and gratitude for God's goodness throughout history!


#### The Responsorial Psalm:

We praise, thank, or call out to God as the lector and the people recite or sing lines from the Book of Psalms in alternating fashion. This practice dates back to the third century. Catholic author, Dr. Thomas Howard, likens our response to hearing someone who shares our deep convictions, and then answering him with "Yes, that's exactly right!" (from: A Biblical Walk through the Mass, Edward Sri, Ascension Press, 2010)

### Weekly Book Discussion Group

Some books are best read slowly and thoughtfully, making notes in the margins as thoughts or questions come to mind, then discussing those thoughts with others. That's how this group moves through books by current and contemporary authors on Christian Spirituality.

Our next book is "Care of the soul – A guide for cultivating depth and sacredness in everyday life" by Thomas Moore, PhD.
