

Sponsor Certificates: May be obtained by registered, practicing members of our parish who have received the three sacraments of initiation: Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist (and, if Married, were married in the church).

Greetings of Peace.

Even though we celebrated our Civic Holiday on Thursday, this is actually considered the "July 4th weekend!" More about the 4th of July, below. But first...

Last week I spoke of some of our "Summer Projects" for our parish Buildings and Grounds. In a related matter, our Parish Finance Council was recently budgeting for this fiscal year (July 1 though June 30) and we were looking at the trends in our **Sunday Offertory collections** (the main means of support for our parish). We noticed that offerings were trending downward - perhaps as a result of the adjusted weekend mass schedule implemented in December 2018? We saw a rather significant decline from December 2018 through February 2019 (and into March). Things seems to have leveled off a bit since Lent and Easter, continuing to this point in time. However, we will continue to be attentive to the giving patterns in our parish. You may recall in late 2016 we made an Offertory Enhancement Campaign to increase our collections. Your response to our campaign was very generous. Thank you very much. We ask each parishioner to give as you are able and please know we are most grateful for your continued support of the parish with your generous contributions. Thank you very much. I express my heartfelt thanks.



About the 4th of July, did you know this U.S. National Holiday has been celebrated by Americans on every continent? In 1934 Richard Byrd was in Antarctica at his base 'Little America." Byrd and his men set off fireworks in a storm when the temperature was actually quite warm for them, 33 degrees below zero!

Such 4th of July festivities are as old as the United States itself.

In 1778, while George Washington celebrated the 4th of July with his troops in Princeton, New Jersey; Benjamin Franklin was in Paris, throwing a party for Americans and some French supporters of America.

Some 4th of July traditions are timeless. "Parades, speeches, music, public readings of the Declaration of Independence. Those were started in the days after the declaration was adopted and continue today."

Fireworks, first authorized by Congress for 4th of July, 1777, are another legacy. In our times, it is estimated that more than 14,000 fireworks displays light up U.S. skies each July 4th.

Nineteenth-century Independence Days featured noisy artillery salutes, as explosives left over from various wars were fired all day during the 4th of July. The practice faded as cannons aged and fell into disrepair.

Meanwhile, new traditions have arisen - many of which would have surely stumped the Founding Fathers - like Hot Dog Eating contests!

It turns out the Declaration of Independence was taken to the printer on July 4th, so that was the date he printed on the top.

It did not become a Federal Holiday until 1941.

John Adams said to his wife, Abigail, about America's independence, "I am apt to believe that it will be celebrated, by succeeding generations, as the great anniversary festival..." Adams is credited with saying, "It ought to be solemnized with Pomp and Parade, with Shews [Shows], Games, Sports... Bells, Bonfires and Illuminations from one end of this continent to the other from this time forward forever more." Seems to me John Adams' Independence Day vision remains "on the mark" more than two centuries later!



Notes from Deacon Denny



The second level of "common good" is rather obvious. "Common" is not being the Lone Ranger. **Being** in relation with others is *transactional*. This is the second level of common good. While each party benefits from a positive transaction, in the sense of common good, each relationship between parties is not self-centered, it is not divisible,

and it is not diminished when shared. Hmm. Typically, a transaction is oriented to a need; personal or community. In the context of our Christian faith, we as respected persons, each with innate value and gifts to share, when we autonomously collaborate toward common good, find this voluntary action invoking hope, joy and enthusiasm which defines the virtue of mankind in the Spirit. This Baptismal call, this need to collaborate in community is strengthened by our Confirmation and nourished in our Eucharistic celebrations where we grow in the capacity to go far beyond the self into the Spirit dimension which dwells in each of us, that is our becoming.

So how do we arrive at these transactions which are beyond ourselves as individuals? Again, we could take a lesson from Scripture; we could climb a tree like Zacchaeus, receive the living water like the woman at the well, or maybe fall off a horse like Saul. Or not. What do they all have in common (pun intended)? A new awareness, a new perspective, gained in relationships with others in a new context. While often in Scripture it is in relationship to Jesus, through our baptism we are called to seek out new awareness through our relationships with others. That's when while transacting in the Spirit at the level of our faith where hope resides, we find the joyful discovery of "common good". Something greater than the sum of the participants. This week you may want to reflect on those times when you used your gifts to provide a positive, perhaps unexpected outcome, in another's life. Putting those events together may just be an indicator of where God looks for you to continue your good work.
