

- **Funerals:** Please contact the parish office before scheduling or publishing (generally through a funeral director). *Bereavement committee available for hospitality.*
- **Sponsor Certificates:** May be obtained by registered, practicing members of our parish who have received the three sacraments of initiation: Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist (and, if Married, were married in the church). Please contact the Parish Office for more details.

New Parishioners: Welcome to St. Joan of Arc!



Greetings of Peace. We begin the month of August this weekend. Amazing! School starts in a few weeks.

Did you know that many of the months of the year are named after "ancient" Roman leaders or from Roman lore? And, originally, there were 10 months, not 12.

This month, the month of August, was named in honor of Roman Emperor Augustus Caesar. July in honor of Julius Caesar.

The month of March was originally the first month and is said to be named for Mars, the god of war. The month of April is thought to stem from the Latin word "*aperio,"* perhaps pointing to plants, flowers, and trees that "open" in the April springtime. May and June are named for goddesses, Maia and Juno. The other original 10 months are referenced to their "number." September, meaning "7" was the 7th month. Likewise, October, November, and December were the 8, 9, and 10th months).

Eventually, January and February were added to the calendar, giving all 12 months proper names. As a result, the length of each month was adjusted. January was named after Janus, the Roman god of beginnings. February (Februa) is thought to have come from a Roman festival readying for spring as well as washing and cleansing.

All that being said, I hope enjoy the month of August!

As we know, we are still in the midst of this Covid pandemic. As the diocese of Cleveland has indicated, masks are optional (at this time) in church and on parish grounds – yet encouraged for those who are not vaccinated or who are "at risk." There are variants of the virus becoming more prevalent (especially the Delta variant). Let's remain vigilant, alert, prudent, and continue to wash our hands, be attentive to those who might be at risk, and, if we are not feeling well, stay home until we are better. Moreover, although the dispensation from the obligation to attend mass has been lifted by our bishops, each one of us can determine whether or not to attend mass – based on "good reasons." Here's to our health!


Looking ahead, we are trying to determine the best course of action here at St. Joan of Arc regarding Altar Servers. We have not had Servers at mass for 1-1/2 years, since March 2020. If we enlist Altar Servers it would be prudent to have a gathering of those were Servers and (and would like to continue to serve) and also recruit and train new Servers. (Those who are in grade 6 and older can be Altar Servers.) Another thing we may need to consider is whether or not Servers have been vaccinated. And yet another matter is the white robes (albs) for Servers. Is it advisable for servers to wear an alb that someone else has worn? If we would have Servers and use robes, we are in need of someone who would manage the care, washing, organization, and do any needed repairs of the robes. Prior to the pandemic, we had "an angel" who did all this for us. She has since "retired" and we have no one for this role, at present. And so, if someone would be interested in caring for the Servers' robes (washing, sewing, organizing, and the like) or in working with us to train Altar Servers, please let us know. We would appreciate your help. "More to come" on servers – as we approach the beginning of a new school year and fall – perhaps in September.

Additionally, we are looking for someone – or a small group of people – to serve as "Sacristan" at St. Joan. (One person expressed an interest is helping. This is great! Anyone else?) The sacristan (or "sacristy crew") would attend to many "behind-the-scenes" details at church, including care for our altar cloths, linens, candles, vessels, inventory of hosts and wine, and other details related to what we do in church for sacred worship. Please contact our parish office if you would like to help. Thank you.

Finally, please note: I am away from the parish – participating in a workshop and taking a few days for vacation. I will return for confessions and mass the weekend of on Saturday August 7 (and Sunday August 8). While I am away there will not be a "daily mass" this week – the week of August 2-6. Our parish and ministerial staff will do their best to respond to any matters that come up and our neighboring priests will do their best to respond to any "sacramental emergencies" and assist at St. Joan of Arc, as they are able. Thank you SJA Staff and Fathers.
