

Greetings of Peace. This is the most special and sacred week of the church year – Holy Week. Even in the midst of a pandemic, we celebrate the Days of our Salvation.

"Jesus of Nazareth requests that we share in his Passion, Death, and Resurrection!"

Our parish Holy Week schedule includes:

- Palm Sunday weekend:

Saturday mass at * 4:30 PM and Sunday 9:00 AM &11:00 AM

- Holy Thursday evening mass of the Lord's Supper at * 7:00 PM

Good Friday Solemn Passion at * 3:00 PM

- Easter mass:

Saturday 8:00 PM and Sunday * 9:00 AM & 11:00 AM

The Holy Week liturgies indicated, above, with an asterisk (*) will be available on our parish website stjoanofarcchurch.org. Moreover, the dispensation from the obligation to attend mass remains in effect until further notice, the bishops remind us. Please keep this in mind as we look to Holy Week – since many of our Holy Week liturgies have been "well attended" in previous years. Because of the pandemic,

- Entrance to church will be limited and on a "first come" basis

- Doors will open about 1/2 hour before the "start time" for each liturgy/mass

- Once we reach our maximum capacity (of about 125) we will not be able to admit any others into the church out of caution and safety

- All are to wear masks that cover both our nose and mouth

- Be attentive to safety protocols and "distancing" before, during, and after all liturgies

I recently read, "This is the time of Spring Break, yet CoVid has not yet taken a break." As a matter of fact, varied forms or strains of the virus seem to be spreading. Let's strive to be safe and to look out for the well-being of each other.

For Palm Sunday weekend, blessed palms will be handed out as people enter church. Palms will also be available on tables in the gathering area as we depart church. Finally, palms available outside after the 11 AM mass – at the overhang at the main doors of the church for about 1/2 hour after mass.

And a note about the "Blessing of Food." This year we will not have a public (or "in person") food blessing on Holy Saturday. Rather, we have a blessing in this week's bulletin that individuals or families may use in your own household. (It was also in last week's bulletin and is included in an e-Message to those parishioners who are on our "email list.") It is very appropriate to use this prayer to give thanks to God – particularly a prayer and blessing of Easter Foods.

Know that you, are in my heart and prayers, particularly during this most Holy Week of the year.

These are the Days of our Salvation. Rejoice and give thanks in God's love for us.

A Food Blessing for Families and Households



Adapted from "Book of Blessings" Prepared by International Commission on English in the Liturgy (ICEL), a Joint Commission of Catholic Bishops' Conferences, The Liturgical Press, Collegeville, Minnesota, 1989, 2012.

The leader begins: In the name of the Father, and of the Son (+), and of the Holy Spirit.

The leader continues: Christ became obedient for our sake, accepting death, death on a cross. Therefore God exalted him and gave him the name above all other names. Blessed be God for ever.

All reply: Blessed be God for ever.

Scripture Reading (based on Deuteronomy 8/7ff)

Reader: For the Lord your God is bringing you into a good land, a land of brooks of water, of fountains and springs, flowing forth in valleys and hills, a land of wheat and barley, of vines and fig trees...a land of olive trees and honey, a land in which...you will lack nothing...and you shall bless the Lord, your God, for the good land he has given you!

All pause for a moment of reflection, then the leader says: The Son of God invites us to the Paschal feast; we call upon him in our need.

Leader (or another reader): That Easter may find us cleansed of sin and ready to live anew our Christian faith, we pray to the Lord. And all reply: Lord hear our prayer

That the bread we share may be a reminder of the bread of life we share in the eucharist, we pray to the Lord.

That we may be ready to share with those who hunger and thirst, we pray to the Lord.

That we may one day enjoy the banquet of the Lord in the heavenly kingdom, we pray to the Lord.

The leader says: At the Savior's command and formed by divine teaching, we dare to say

And all pray together: Our Father, who art in heaven...

The leader then prays:

God of glory, the eyes of all turn to you and you provide for them in due season. As we celebrate Christ's victory over sin and death bless us and this food (+) of our joyous Easter Season. (All may make the sign of the cross over the foods.) May we who gather at our banquet table continue to celebrate the joy of his resurrection and be admitted finally to his heavenly banquet. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

All together conclude:

In the name of the Father, and of the Son (+), and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.




