

From the Pastor



Greetings of Easter Peace.

It is amazing that we are now in the last part of April and May draws near. With the rain we have had lately, the apt phrase "April showers bring May Flowers" rings true. And the flowers are already blooming! Soon we will enter the month of May when we will have more "May Flowers," First Communion (the weekend of May 4-5 in our parish), then Mother's Day, Graduations, and more. Later in May we have Memorial Day – and the Blossom Festival in Chagrin! (Even with the "Bridge project" in 'downtown Chagrin.') Then the "summer months" of June, July, and August. Those are the three (3) "unofficial months of summertime!"

Let us also remember to pray for our children who will be receiving First Communion in a couple of weeks!

This weekend (the weekend of the Fourth Sunday of Easter) is often called "Good Shepherd Sunday" since the gospel we hear at weekend masses tells us about Jesus, who is our Good Shepherd. Did we ever take time to reflect on who Jesus is for us? Yes, he is the Good Shepherd? Moreover, Jesus is not only the Good Shepherd, he is the "sheep-gate." He is the Lamb of God. He is the one who seeks us out when we are the "lost sheep." He is our Passover meal. He is the one who leads us to good and eternal pastures. And more! Jesus died for us. He loves us. Let us show our love for him by following him and his voice! Amen.

One more note. I will be out of town ("Gone Fishing"") – leaving this Sunday after the 9:00 AM mass, April 21. I will return for the weekend of May 4-5. There will not be a "daily mass" at St. Joan of Arc while I am away – that is this week, the week of April 22 – and also the week of April 29. Our wonderful ministerial staff will continue to be of service here at SJA while I am away and our priest-neighbors will do their best to be of assistance, if the need presents itself. In the Garden of Life with Toni Colini Plants of the Week April 21, 2024

Each week we will highlight plants on the church grounds describing a Biblical or Marian connection. Where the plant can be found on the grounds and a brief description.

<u>Helleborus orientalis- Lenten Rose</u>

Plant Type: Evergreen perennial that blooms during the Lenten season. **Bloom:** Passion purple to rose to cream, late winter to early spring. **Culture:** Partial shade to shade.

Biblical Connection: Blooms during Lent in the colors of the passion of Christ and may have been present at the time of Christ's crucifixion.

Where: At the main entrance of the Church on each side of the entry doors.

<u>Narcissus poeticus- Our Lady's star, or Daffodils</u>

Plant Type: Spring bulb of many varieties and sizes with blooming times of early March through April.

Bloom: 6 petals with a center cup or corona in colors of yellow, orange, white, green, and pink.

Flower sizes from 2 inches to 4 inches and heights of 3 inches to 14 inches.

Culture: Light shade to sun, while being adaptable to a variety of soil types.

Biblical Connection: Daffodils supposedly started blooming at the tomb upon Jesus's

resurrection. The flower corona looks like the 6 sided Star of David representing Mary and

Jesus's lineage. The gold center represents Mary's crown, the fragrance her sweetness and love.

Along with many other symbols of Mary and other Saints.

Where: All over the grounds of SJA, many varieties.

Mertensia virginica- Our Lady's Thimble or Virginia Bluebells

Plant Type: Spring blooming perennial, a native wildflower in Ohio.

Bloom: Buds of passion purple that open in a deep blue. Blooms around the feast day of St. George – April 23 rd .

Culture: A true shade perennial, prefers moisture and will tolerate wetness. A native wildflower. **Biblical Connection:** The flower looks like a thimble which told that the Blessed Mother would have used as a spinner of wool, weaver of linens, and embroiderer. The six stamens and pistil within the flower represent the seven sorrows of Mary and the pistil her biggest sorrow Jesus. The purple buds reminding us of his passion.

Where: The entrance walk into the Garden of Life on the street side.
