

Greetings of Peace.

School begins here at St. Joan of Arc. "Welcome back" to our students, faculty, staff, principal, and support personnel. Here's hoping it will be a very good year! More will be said about "school," below.



This weekend, August 17-18, 2024 we participate in the Annual Missionary Cooperative Appeal. Each parish in our diocese is asked to offer some support to benefit the "greater needs of the church throughout the world."

As of this writing, I understand that we will welcome a bishop and a priest from the Diocese of Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh as we are asked to support an initiative in their diocese called Talithacumi Unanti... which is a cause against human trafficking and also promotes girl education.

In that region of India, all the catholic schools are shut down by the present government and as a result Catholic girls do not have proper facilities for education.

Many girls from that region are taken to the Middle East to work as domestic worker and about 5,500 women belonging to Dalit (formerly untouchables) are taken to countries like Qatar, Dubai, Saudi Arabia. They have no education or skill. They are exploited emotionally, physically and do not enjoy any human rights. They get to go home only once in 5 years. Recently one woman wanted to visit her family and she was not allowed to visit and care for her sick children. Upon persistent asking, they brutally cut her hand. Such is the way Indian women are treated in the Middle East.

Moreover, girls are bearing the brunt of gender inequality, Christian schools in that region in India are closed or closing, Dalit girls are the common victims of such domestic violence, some girls have taken up job as workers in the health and social sector and enter another layer of discrimination and helplessness, girls who work as domestic helpers face a serious risk of exploitation, and more...

As you may notice, we did some work on our parking lot and have done some other "Parish Improvements," and still have more to do. As I recently shared, since the Covid shutdown in Spring of 2020, we have "held back" doing some work on our parish buildings and grounds because of the pandemic, "lighter" attendance at mass, a decline in some revenues, the difficulty in arranging for workers to do some of the tasks, and more. Some areas here at St. Joan of Arc that have needed attention are our parking lot, areas of the exterior and paint in and on our buildings, some plumbing needs, carpet cleaning, and more. As of this writing we have already begun some maintenance on our parking lot, have arranged for painting, did some carpet cleaning and also some basic plumbing (and there is more work to be done on our plumbing). As you know your homes and property need regular maintenance. So, too, do our parish buildings and grounds. We have tried to prioritize jobs that need attention and have done our best to budget for those tasks. It is your generous commitment and offerings that make all this possible. Thank you. We strive to be good stewards of what is entrusted to us and offer a heartfelt "Thank You" for your support.

Finally, I mentioned our parking lot, above... and since our Day School begins this week... let me mention two virtues – namely courtesy and safety. Please show these virtues in our daily living! And in our parish parking lot!!



Please be "courteous" and park in the lined/marked parking places at St. Joan of Arc and avoid making "our own parking places." We also ask that the designated areas for "handicapped" parking be respected. Not only is all of this courteous, but necessary in the event that any emergency vehicle would need to come to St. Joan of Arc during mass – or anytime the parking lot is being used. Thank you for your cooperation.



Also, please be attentive and drive slowly through the parish lot. This is the virtue of "Safety." ALL of us can be attentive to this – parishioners, students, staff, faculty, visitors, and everyone!

Yes, I am known to say that "Safety" and "Courtesy" are virtues as much as Faith, Hope, and Love.

Eucharistic Adoration and Benediction at St. Joan of Arc: Will be the Thursday before the First Friday from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m.






Baptism Class



Special Note:

To receive the sacrament of Eucharist in 2nd grade, two years of regular religious education are required. Therefore, if you have a child entering 1st grade this school year, please make sure to register him/her in our SJA Parish School of Religion for the 2024-2025 school year.

To receive the sacrament of Confirmation in 8th grade, two years of regular religious education are required. Therefore, if you have a child entering 7 th grade this school year, please make sure to register him/her in our SJA Parish School of Religion for the 2024-2025 school year. For Confirmation in 8th grade, in addition to attendance of a regular religious education class, attendance in our supplemental Confirmation preparation program will be required.

If your child attends a Catholic school, they do not need to attend our PSR classes, however, for Confirmation as an 8th grader, they will need to register for our Confirmation preparation program only.

NOTE FROM DEACON DENNYCOMMON GROUND

All too often, we as Catholics and those who seek to understand our "Faith" suspect that it's about the "rules & rubrics" to which we proscribe. Yet throughout human history, various faith traditions, including the Judaic (Old Testament) and even the Native American (Vision Quest) search for an understanding of God in our lives, suggest themes of "journey", "discovery" and essentially the possibility of "transformation" of ourselves and how we think andi what "we believe". These traditions and others as well all share common themes of how we approach the questions that arise in our minds and hearts in search of understanding and our relationship to God and His "Presence" in our lives and in the world.

The RCIA (OCIA) program, which continues to evolve since Vatican II in the mid 1960's, while defining "rubrics" and "rites" is really the backbone of the evolving traditions which attempts to link our Sacraments and teachings to our faith and treasure of Scripture to tell the story of how "transformation" has and continues to work for us all.

The whole of the perspective, transcends and even combines, utilizing many traditions, a **community** that companions individuals on their search for becoming who God calls them to be. "We are human, weak and without power. But if we take the risk, if we make the effort, if we claim our own sacred space to invite the vision of God into our lives, we will be transformed. We will receive the wisdom and blessing of God and be given all we need to do our part in rolling back the evil that separates us from one another and from all living things around us."(1)

We are evolving our OCIA at SJA to grow a wider team to be that community that welcomes and refreshes any "inquirer" to grow their faith, to be transformed in heart and soul and join the community of faith by sharing their gifts, as well. Next week, how we plan to grow that effort.
