

From the Pastor

Greetings of Peace. We are approaching the end of August.



School is ready to begin in our area. Here at St. Joan of Arc our parish Day School begins this week! Thank you to Mrs. Stacie Webster, our Day School principal, and the teachers and school support staff for your work in preparing for another great year.

Some young adults in our parish are heading to college or returning to college. Many stores have already displayed their Halloween candy, decorations, and costumes! As we approach September we might begin to think of the Season of Fall. Yet, we generally have some very warm and humid days in the early days of the school year – often through September into October! And many of us say we enjoy the change of times and seasons – particularly Fall!

Autumn is a wonderful season of the year.

We are also preparing for those who will participate in our Parish School of Religion and our sacramental preparation for Confirmation and Communion this year. Mrs. Mary Vincenti and the Office of Faith Formation (with Sr. Theresa) are hard at work and doing an excellent job! Moreover, the entire Ministerial Staff of St. Joan of Arc is preparing for another year of activities, meetings, gatherings, etc. This includes Mr. Jon Thibo with our parish music, Ms. Allie Gall and our parish Youth Ministry, and Mrs. Millie Prebel, our Pastoral Minister who helps with many and varied parish groups and committees. Well done and thank you for your good work in our parish.

Still, we are in summertime. Please take some time for rest, relaxation, prayer, and recreation. These virtues help us become better people.

Speaking of virtues, let me mention two virtues in particular – namely Courtesy and Safety, especially in our parking lot.

-Please be "courteous" and park in the lined parking places at St. Joan of Arc and avoid making "our own parking places." We also ask that the designated areas for "handicapped" parking be respected. Not only is all of this courteous, but parking is necessary in the event emergency vehicles need to come to St. Joan of Arc during masses – or anytime the parking lot is being used. Thank you for your cooperation.

-Also in our parking lot, please be attentive and drive slowly through the parish lot. This is the virtue of "Safety." ALL of us can be attentive to this - parishioners, students, staff, faculty, visitors, and everyone!

Yes, I am known to say that "Safety" and "Courtesy" are virtues as much as Faith, Hope, and Love.

As I mentioned in last week's column, I have received numerous memos from the Diocese of Cleveland and the Ohio Bishops about the next election in Ohio that will take place on November 7, 2023. In part, a letter of 7/31/2023 from the diocese said,

"The amendment to enshrine abortion into the Ohio Constitution will officially be on the November 7, 2023 ballot. The church must not be silent and cannot remain on the sidelines when confronted with such a clear threat to human life. Therefore, the Catholic Conference of Ohio (CCO) in collaboration with the Catholic dioceses across the state...is informing Catholics in Ohio about the dangers of the amendment and encourage them to vote no..."In addition, memo from Bishop Malesic and the Ohio Bishops gave specific points and a "timeline" that all parishes have been asked to follow. We will comply. And so more will be said about "all this" in coming columns and bulletins until the November election.

- -Please vote! (If not registered to vote, please so so.)
- -Secondly, we should allow our faith influence us as we form our consciences as we seek to become informed on issues and candidates...
- -Also note, the Church does not support or oppose particular candidates; the church does seek to focus attention on the moral and human dimensions of issues. I have been known to say, "The church is...and always will be...pro-Life."

Looking ahead – since we are approaching September. Please note our "daily mass schedule" will be adjusted on Tuesdays beginning in September – so our Day School can participate regularly at our parish mass. The "daily mass" on Tuesdays will be at 9 AM throughout the "school year" – the months of September through May. In the months of June, July, and August, the Tuesday morning mass is at 8 AM; in the "school year," Tuesday mass is 9 AM. Thank you for making a note of this!

Sacrament of Matrimony: Please contact a priest or deacon at least one year before the anticipated date.

Care of the Sick and Elderly: Please inform us of those who are sick, aged, unable to come to church, homebound, hospitalized, or may need the Sacrament of Anointing.

Funerals: Please contact the parish office before scheduling or publishing (generally through a funeral director).

Sponsor Certificates: May be obtained by registered, practicing members of our parish who have received the three sacraments of initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist (and, if married, were married in the Church). Please contact the Parish Office for more details.

Sessions in the Catholic Faith (RCIA): Thursdays at 6:30pm, September - May. Contact Deacon Jeff at 440-376-9177

Eucharistic Adoration and Benediction at St. Joan of Arc: Will be the Thursday before the First Friday from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m.

So where are we headed?

SYNODALITY-COMMUNITY-BUILDING THE BODY OF CHRIST

Synodality is about opening up the discussion. As we evolve as a Church and as a society, things change. We change, the world we live in changes, and how we do things; how we communicate, how we "be" church for one another, changes too. As we begin to look at the challenges for young families, bringing up their children in the world of today, a new perspective is emerging. Seeking new pathways of being Church is the goal. How do we share our values and beliefs? How do we approach new responsibilities of raising our families with an awareness of what our Church and Traditions of the Catholic Church teaches? We need to start that conversation in earnest. What are the questions that you have and how do we convene to share the Good News that our Faith and Church can provide? We are beginning that task over the weeks and months to come. At the same time, we realize that it all evolves through "COMMIUNITY".

Community is the pathway to the support of one another and the convening of people who share our values and seek to grow together amidst the challenges of today. Our Parish Festival coming in September is one such event in a growing array of new possibilities. Families of every age, convening to share their stories, their lives and support of each other in celebration of who we are. Over many generations our Parish's have been a resource for communicating, sharing, and validating each other in the context of common good. Well-being for everyone in the flock. Discovering and or assisting one another in the culture and society we face every day. As we come out of our Covid experience, we need to refresh our communities. Special Note:

To receive the sacrament of Eucharist in 2nd grade, two years of regular religious education are required. Therefore, if you have a child entering 1st grade this school year, please make sure to register him/her in our SJA Parish School of Religion for the 2023-2024 school year. To receive the sacrament of Confirmation in 8th grade, two years of regular religious education are required. Therefore, if you have a child entering 7th grade this school year, please make sure to register him/her in our SJA Parish School of Religion for the 2023-2024 school year. For Confirmation in 8th grade, in addition to attendance of a regular religious education class, attendance in our supplemental Confirmation preparation program will be required. If your child attends a Catholic school, they do not need to attend our PSR classes, however, for Confirmation as an 8th grader, they will need to register for our Confirmation preparation program only.
