From the Pastor

Greetings of Peace,



We are in the final days of August and approaching September. As we do each year, our "daily mass schedule" will be adjusted on Tuesdays beginning in September. This way our parish Day School can participate regularly at our parish mass on Tuesdays. The "daily mass" on Tuesdays will be at 9 AM throughout the "school year" – beginning Tuesday September 5, 2023. This will continue for the months of September through May. In the months of June, July, and August, the Tuesday morning mass is at 8 AM; in the "school year," Tuesday mass is 9 AM. Thank you for making a note of this!

Continuing on the topic of the November 7, 2023 election in Ohio - which I have been writing about the past couple of weeks - I receive regular memos from the Diocese of Cleveland and the Ohio Bishops. We were given specific points and a "timeline" that all parishes have been asked to follow and share. Here at SJA, we will comply. And so more will be said about this in coming columns and bulletins until the November election. Locally, Our St. Joan of Arc Angels Life enables our community to take action to help safeguard the dignity of all life - from conception to natural death. I want to commend them and offer our prayers and support for their good works and encourage everyone to do our part to promote the sanctity of all human life. At the promptings of Bishop Malesic, the Human Life Office of the Diocese of Cleveland, and the Ohio Bishops, we have been instructed to say more about the coming November election so that we, as Catholics, can be clear and strong in our belief to uphold and defend life. Bishop Malesic and the Ohio Bishops have said that the church must not be silent and cannot remain on the sidelines when confronted with such a clear threat to human life. Therefore, the Catholic Conference of Ohio (CCO) in collaboration with the Catholic dioceses across the state...is informing Catholics in Ohio about the dangers of the amendment and encourage them to vote no. We should allow our faith influence us as we form our consciences and seek to become informed on issues - and candidates... Also note, the Church does not support or oppose particular candidates; the church does seek to focus attention on the moral and human dimensions of issues. I have been known to say, "The church is...and always will be...pro-Life." Again, more to come in future bulletins...

Finally, looking ahead, Monday September 4, 2023, is Labor Day. Our "daily mass" on Labor Day is at 9 AM.

Sacrament of Matrimony: Please contact a priest or deacon at least one year before the anticipated date.

WHERE DOES IT SAY THAT?



THIS CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT...

THREATENS PARENTAL RIGHTS

By using "individual" instead of adult or woman, anyone under the age of 18 could have an abortion or make any other reproductive decision without their parents' consent or notification.

PUTS WOMEN AT RISK

Current Ohio laws* require abortion providers to explain procedure risks and ensure access to hospital transfer if needed. These health and safety standards could be seen as a "burden" and be eliminated, making it even less safe for women seeking an abortion.

ALLOWS ABORTIONS THROUGH 9 MONTHS OF PREGNANCY

In U.S. law,** "health" includes age or physical, emotional, or psychological well-being. This means a woman's age or emotional health could be cited to justify aborting a full-term baby. An abortion-providing physician would decide when a baby could survive outside the womb, leaving no clear protections for preborn children.

IS MISLEADING

Referring to "miscarriage care" promotes a myth that a "right to abortion" is necessary to preserve care for miscarriages and ectopic pregnancies. This is false. Catholic hospitals have always provided comprehensive miscarriage care and will continue to do so regardless of the outcome of this vote.

ARTICLE I, SECTION 22

The Right to Reproductive Freedom with Protections for Health and Safety

- Every individual has a right to make and carry out one's own reproductive decisions, including but not limited to decisions on contraception, fertility treatment, continuing one's own pregnancy, miscarriage care, and abortion.
- The State shall not, directly or indirectly, burden, penalize, prohibit, interfere with, or discriminate against either an individual's voluntary exercise of this right or a person or entity that assists an individual exercising this right, unless the State demonstrates that it is using the least restrictive means to advance the individual's health in accordance with widely accepted and evidence-based standards of care.
- However, abortion may be prohibited after fetal viability. But in no case may such an abortion be prohibited if in the professional judgment of the pregnant patient's treating physician it is necessary to protect the pregnant patient's life or health.
- 4. As used in this Section, "Fetal viability" means "the point in a pregnancy when, in the professional judgment of the pregnant patient's treating physician, the fetus has a significant likelihood of survival outside the uterus with reasonable measures. This is determined on a case-by-case basis"; and "State" includes any governmental entity and political subdivision.
- 5. This Section is self-executing.

BUILDING COMMON GROUND Notes from Deacon Denny

BASKETS...PART 1- BUILDING OUR COMMUNITY

In the Rite of Baptism, we are all called to become a Saint. We "wash away" sin, we are anointed Priest, Prophet & King (Shepherd). Then, the welcoming Church recognizing that you have become a new creation in Christ, are given a white garment from the hands of our community. We as Church then offer you a lit candle from the Easter Paschal candle, to receive the Light of Christ, where parents, Godparents, and the whole Church join in support of raising this child of God in our Faith, **all** taking on that responsibility.

As a Sacramental Church, one of the next Sacraments for the newly Baptized will be First Communion, in receiving the Body of Christ in the Eucharist. But how do we "be" Church for this child and this family for the next 5 to 7 years? This "Part 1" note is about gathering these families and connecting them to "us" the Church, the Body of Christ.

In preparing families for Baptizing their children over the past many years, and as a married Deacon, particularly in our Parish in Chagrin Falls, Ohio, a number of key points emerge.

- Anny young families discover that these beautiful babies, do not arrive with an instruction book!
- Charting a course forward in health and wellness for the whole family is in itself a challenge.
- Finding social and learning opportunities for parents and children alike, within a community sharing our values and aspirations, defines a community that we must discover.
- Connecting with those "in-betweens"; a competent baby sitter for two hours, finding a pediatrician, information on a school or program, or just finding and talking to a compadre/companion to share a moment, requires connecting to a community.

What if new families to our Parish or those Baptizing their children were enrolled in a new network? In today's world that means a communication and information platform nestled appropriately in todays social communications. However, how do we define the ways of communicating and further find out what they need? Our upcoming Parish Festival is the first step. We need to invite these families to meet us, where we are, seeking to journey with them in building our Parish community in support of one another. We need to jointly define our best way forward. So, the first part is the invitation. Via email, text, and yes personal invitation, we need to simply "sign them up" by inviting them. We will have a "sign up table" at the Festival, encouraging the beginning of the discussion. For signing up, each family will have a chance to win a "Welcoming Basket" representing who we are as community, gathering as community to build new pathways. More to come next week. Blessings. Please keep our catechists, children, and their families in your prayers as we begin this new school year!

Special Note:

To receive the sacrament of Eucharist in 2 nd grade, two years of regular religious education are required. Therefore, if you have a child entering 1 st grade this school year, please make sure to register him/her in our SJA Parish School of Religion for the 2023-2024 school year.



To receive the sacrament of Confirmation in 8th grade, two years of regular religious education are required. Therefore, if you have a child entering 7th grade this school year, please make sure to register him/her in our SJA Parish School of Religion for the 2023-2024 school year. For Confirmation in 8th grade, in addition to attendance of a regular religious education class, attendance in our supplemental Confirmation preparation program will be required.

If your child attends a Catholic school, they do not need to attend our PSR classes, however, for Confirmation as an 8th grader, they will need to register for our Confirmation preparation program only.
