

From the Pastor

Greetings of Peace in early August!

This weekend we remember the Transfiguration of the Lord on the mountain. I like the description of this feast that says The Lord showed on the outside who he is on the inside! Let's pray that we can allow the light and love of God to shine through us and our lives!

I shared this a couple of weeks ago, and it bears repeating here...

There is a "special election" in Ohio this week on Tuesday, August 8. I have had a few questions about the coming election and it is prudent to be attentive to what the church and our bishops have to say to us at this time.

- First of all, please vote!
- Secondly, we should allow our faith to influence us as we form our consciences as we seek to become informed on issues and candidates, when they are on the ballot.
- Thirdly, the Church does not support or oppose particular candidates; the church does seek to focus attention on the moral and human dimensions of issues.

Recently Pope Francis and the Ohio and US Bishops have drawn our attention to important issues such as respect for all life as well as looking at other challenging topics and issues that demand our attention, especially as we cast our ballots. May the Holy Spirit guide us and our decisions about how we vote, inspired by our faith, and considering the common good of our community, state, and nation. Ultimately, let us pray that each of us might do God's will in all things!

Particularly, regarding Issue 1 and the election on August 8. The bishops of Ohio have stated that Issue 1 is essentially a vote about a procedural matter by which Ohioans amend the state constitution and Issue 1 does not directly deal with substantive matters of moral content. As a result, the bishops have not taken a stance on this initiative. The bishops ask that we prayerfully consider what we believe is right and prudent.

One final note: No one has our authorization to distribute partisan political materials (especially on candidates) on parish property, on vehicles, or anywhere else. Those who might do so are not acting in the name of the parish, our church, or diocese. I pray that each of us may be good citizens – and faithful.

Finally, looking ahead to Tuesday, August 15. We celebrate the Assumption of Mary into Heaven – a Holy Day of Obligation. Our masses will be at 9 AM and 7 PM on Tuesday, August 15.

Funerals: Please contact the parish office before scheduling or publishing (generally through a funeral director).



BUILDING COMMON GROUND Notes from DEACON DENNY

Q What's been going on with the "synodal process at SJA"?

Since we started the process over a year ago, dozens of parishioners have been in discussions along with many more people, additionally providing input to the discussion. Over the next several weeks, we would like to share our very interesting historical context, from many of the participants, many of whom have been here for more than 30 years, along with our initiatives moving forward.

First, some interesting background. In calling for the initialization of Vatican II, "What instead is necessary today is that the whole of Christian doctrine, with no part of it lost, be received in our times by all with a new fervor . . . For the deposit of faith, the truths contained in our venerable doctrine, are one thing; the fashion in which they are expressed, but with the same meaning and the same judgment, is another thing." Pope John XXIII 1961. This was the invitation to begin the discussion of how the church should address the changing world. Many documents were created including the invitation to discover the role of the laity in collaboration with the whole Church.

Forty years later, "IN NOVO MILLENNIO INEUNTE, John Paul II stressed that living a thoroughly evangelical Catholicism in the twenty-first century would require Catholics, especially in the developed world, to think of themselves and their religious obligations in a radically different way." "Who is to be evangelized?" is straightforward and comprehensive: **everyone.**

Why this background? Our reality at SJA, concurrently within that same timeframe continues to challenge all of us. We used to have two Priests, three Deacons, and anywhere from six to ten religious on campus in support of our activities as a parish. Presently, we have one Priest, one religious and two part-time Deacons. Thankfully, we are now blessed with "laity" stepping up to fill key positions and leadership roles, both from within our Parish and Diocesan trained laity from our wider community as well. Relative to the "Faithful", while our numbers have waned, along the same lines as with the national trend, we are currently having a young family influx into the community, a new growth. That is the great news. At the same time, faced with many challenges we through our Baptism are all called to be Church".....sharing our gifts.

So how do we meet these challenges? Working closely with the diocese and our neighboring area wide Parish's, new approaches to support who we are as Catholic Christian's are beginning. Particularly for our young families, our fallen away Catholics, and those who are curious about our Faith. In this and in other new areas, opportunities for each of us to share our gifts, on our way to becoming Saints is the goal. Much nore to follow.





St. Joan of Arc Music Ministry is preparing for its upcoming year and hopes to add you as a new member! We are in need of additional adult singers, age high school through senior citizens as well as new handbell ringers and hope to form a children's choir from our day school and PSR student bodies. Singers will be asked to meet with Jon Thibo, Director of Music for a brief singalong to identify voice part, we particularly need male voices. Handbell Ringers with musical background are preferred, though the ability to read music is not a requirement as music can be marked with colors to identify which bells are played when, so long as the ringer can count and keep a steady beat. Ringers from grades 8 through high school and all adults are welcome to join our newly reformed Handbell Choir. Children's Choir will be for students grades 2–8 and will meet at a time convenient to all families. Further details will be in the first bulletin of September as all our ensembles will be rehearsing during the months of September through May.
