From the Pastor:

Greetings of Peace.

November is the month we remember, in a special way, "our brothers and sisters who have fallen asleep in the hope of the resurrection." Here at St. Joan of Arc we have our "Book of Remembrance" in the Gathering area for parishioners to inscribe the names of their beloved deceased – and we will remember them in prayer during this month. May the writing of the names of our loved ones who have passed help to console us and remind us of the hope of new life, for which we all long!

This week we celebrate The Solemnity of All Saints on Tuesday November 1, 2022. All Saints Day is a holy day of obligation. Our mass schedule is 9 AM and 7 PM on All Saints Day. The church celebrates All Saints because we choose to honor the holy men and women whose lives and example we admire. Since it is near the end of the church year, All Saints Day invites us into the mystery of death and the promise of eternal life. Let us rejoice with all the saints and take this day as an opportunity to see how we can be more holy, ourselves.

And this coming Saturday November 5 at our 4:30 PM mass, we will remember the Faithful Departed whose funerals or memorials we had in our parish during the past year since last years "All Souls Day." Our dearly departed will be named in a "Litany of Remembrance" and we will lift them up to the Lord in prayer. We are one in faith and fellowship with all the Faithful Departed, whom we remember in a special way in the month of November. "Eternal Rest grant unto them, O Lord."

And, speaking of next Saturday, November 5. That is the night we spin our clocks BACK one hour. (Remember the phrase, "Spring ahead, Fall back?"). We exit "Daylight Savings Time" and will get an extra hour's sleep next weekend on Saturday night. Yet the price we pay" is that it will be dark earlier until late December when we will begin to gain a bit of daylight each day until June! Yes, this is all part of the changing of the times and seasons! I prefer that we would not change our clocks two times each year, yet that is the "current system" that we all need to follow.
