### **Greetings of Peace,**

Greetings of Peace as we enter the Third week of Advent. (This column was written in late November – since "due dates" for our parish bulletin are adjusted around "holidays.")

The Giving and Sharing Tree is up in our church Gathering Area. And this Sunday, December 11, is "Giving Sunday." Your Gifts can help bring the joy of the Christmas Season to those who may need it. Thank you for your generosity and support of this outreach ministry and to those who coordinate this wonderful service in our parish. We ask that your generous gifts be turned in today – deadline is after the 11 AM mass.

In less than two weeks from now we will be celebrating Christmas. For your planning, our Christmas mass schedule is:

- \* Christmas Eve, Saturday December 24: 4:30 PM and 8:00 PM
- \* Christmas Day, Sunday December 25: 9:00 AM and 11:00 AM

Also note there will not be a "daily morning mass" in the parish on Friday December 23 or on Monday December 26.

And more to note about Christmas. Christmas has been a time when many people often come to mass! Christmas masses can be quite crowded. In today's world, with Covid, RSV, colds and flu, we will need to be prudent and practical. If the need presents itself, it may be possible for us to have some "overflow" directed to our Gym for the Christmas eve 4:30 PM mass – and hope to be able to livestream mass there and also "deliver communion" there. Again, this is for the 4:30 PM Christmas eve mass. If this pans out, details will need to be arranged. Furthermore, for those in "high risk" categories or other considerations could perhaps choose to remain home – out of caution and for your own health. Finally, our Christmas mass should be available on the St. Joan of Arc Parish website.

On another matter – and this "connects" with the above discussion on "health and wellness" – the diocese recently sent out a memo indicating that "the cup" may be offered at communion in Diocese of Cleveland. Seems to me this is not simply a matter of having the cup available (or not) at communion time at mass. We have not offered the cup in nearly 3 years. Eucharistic Ministers have not been accustomed to serving in this ministry. "Re-training" may be needed. Moreover, how many of our ministers (including the priest!) are "comfortable" offering the cup, touching the cup from which someone may partake, wiping the cup with the purificator (white cloth), handling the cup and purificator, possibly consuming any left over wine (Blood of Christ)



to address the "layers" involved in this matter, we will look at what is involved. I wanted you to know about the recent memo from the diocese. It is also important to remember that the Lord is fully present when we receive him in communion in the form of Bread.

In Advent we continue to pray, "Come Lord Jesus." May the Lord come into our world today through each of us and in the way we live.


### **Confirmation:**

The Book of the Apocalypse: A 'New' and uplifting 'Old Reading'

A new approach to the Book of Revelation looks back to the oldest interpretation we have, and discovers there a fresh reading. Surprisingly comforting and challenging at the same time, it displays a much more Christian sense of love and mercy than people often think.

Here's the key: everything in the Book of Revelation has already happened, is happening now, and will happen in the future.

Come and explore this ancient understanding on five Monday evenings: January 9, 16, 23, 30, and Feb. 6 at 7 PM. in the Parish Hall. Talks will be given by Rev. Gerald J. Bednar, Ph.D, former associate pastor at SJA., and will last approximately 60 minutes, with time alloted for discussion at the end of each lecture. The final session will feature live input from the Australian author of the new commentary, Rev. Francis Moloney, SDB.
