

From the Pastor

Greetings of Peace.

I hope you had a blessed Thanksgiving.

This column is being written on November 9 – much earlier than usual – since I will be out of town and early "due dates" for our bulletin because of deadlines from our "bulletin company" and our Parish Office's schedule due to Thanksgiving and the holiday weekend...

This weekend we begin Advent! It is less than four weeks until Christmas! Wow. I often reflect on a verse that sums up Advent very well:

When the days were cold and the nights were long and our need for a redeemer was great God sent his son as our Savior!

That says it, doesn't it? Amen.



And as we enter this Advent Season it might be good to reflect on the meaning and purpose of a symbol we often use in this Season: The Advent wreath. Fr. Paul Turner writes about this season and symbol of this season by saying,

"An Advent Wreath symbolizes our longing for the coming of Christ. The wreath is a circle of evergreen branches into which are set four candles. Traditionally three candles are violet and one is rose, but four violet or four white candles may also be used.

"The wreath symbolizes many things. Evergreens signify God's enduring promise of redemption, evident like green branches in the midst of snow. The circle signifies our hope for the return of Christ, whose kingdom will have no end. The colors of the candles match the traditional colors of the vesture for the four Sundays of Advent. Violet garments signify our penitent hope for salvation. The rose color, which may be worn on Advent's Third Sunday, signals that the season is nearly over – joy is at hand!

"The wreath's most luminous symbol is its growing light. One candle is lit on the First Sunday of Advent; two on the Second, three on the Third and all four on the Fourth. In the northern hemisphere, Advent comes at a time when the days decrease to their shortest length. As the hours of darkness increase, we light more candles on the wreath. The wreath, which symbolizes the coming of Christ, grows in intensity as the anniversary of Jesus' birth draws near.

"The Advent wreath may be used at home or at church. It could be blessed on the First Sunday of Advent. When used in homes, the wreath could be blessed by a family member and lit during the evening meal, to remind everyone of the true meaning of this holy season."

Fr. Paul Turner is the pastor of the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in Kansas City, Missouri and director of the Office of Divine Worship for the Diocese of Kansas City-St Joseph. He holds a doctorate in sacred theology from Sant' Anselmo in Rome.

As we wait in joyful hope, let us be attentive to the coming of the Lord - who is with us every day!

Finally, looking ahead, as of this writing, we are told that December 9 is a Holy Day of Obligation this year. It happens that this year, in 2024, December 8 falls on the Second Sunday of Advent – so the solemnity of the Immaculate Conception is transferred to Monday, December 9. Previously, in the USA, when the date of this Holy Day was transferred to a Monday the obligation to attend mass was abrogated ("lifted"). This is no longer the case. "Long story short," Rome recently decreed that when Immaculate Conception is transferred to Monday, the feast must be observed as a day of obligation on the day to which it is transferred. In light of this new directive, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception on Monday, December 9, 2024 is to be observed as a Holy Day of Obligation.

Here at St. Joan of Arc, masses on Monday December 9 will be celebrated at 9 AM and 7 PM, in observance of this Holy Day of Obligation.

One more thing! This weekend we will have a speaker who will talk to us about the "Angel Scholarship" in our parish and the Diocese of Cleveland. Contributions to the Angel Scholarship Fund helps to provide tuition assistance for students to attend our Catholic schools and donors may receive a 100% Ohio income tax credit of up to \$750 (\$1,500 for married couples filing jointly) against their state tax liability. In other words, the state of Ohio allows you to spend some of the state income taxes you must pay anyway to provide tuition assistance for students seeking an education in our Catholic schools. The Angel Scholarship Fund is a win-win-win for taxpayer donors, scholarship recipients, and our diocese! Contributions can be made online or through a mail-in form. Thank you for your consideration and support!
