From the Pastor

Greetings of Peace as we begin Advent! This year Christmas is just over 3 weeks away from the beginning of Advent! That is not even a month!! As a matter of fact Advent is the shortest it can possibly be this year. The 4th Sunday of Advent is actually December 24th – Christmas Eve!

Please note: This column is being written in early-to-mid November because of the Thanksgiving holiday, early due dates from our bulletin company and our parish office, and my travels.

In the Season of Advent, we "wait in joyful hope." And we hope "things will get better in our world" in the midst tension, wars, violence, and also dealing with CoVid, RSV, and Colds/the Flu. Preparations for Christmas (in our homes and church) may need to be "flexible."

This is the season we have our "Giving and Sharing Tree" in our church Gathering Area. This year we are accepting Gift Cards as well as gifts – as requested on the tags on the tree. This is one great way to bring the joy of the Christmas Season to those who may need it. Thank you for your generosity and support of this outreach ministry and to those who coordinate this wonderful service in our parish. Gifts are "due" prior to the 11 AM mass on Sunday December 10. Thank you for your generosity.



As we enter this Advent Season it might be good to reflect on the meaning and purpose of a symbol we often use in this Season: The Advent wreath. Fr. Paul Turner writes about this season and symbol by saying, "An Advent Wreath symbolizes our longing for the coming of Christ. The wreath is a circle of evergreen branches into which are set four candles. Traditionally three candles are violet and one is rose, but four violet or four white candles may also be used."

"The wreath symbolizes many things. Evergreens signify God's enduring promise of redemption, evident like green branches in the midst of snow. The circle signifies our hope for the return of Christ, whose kingdom will have no end. The colors of the candles match the traditional colors of the vesture for the four Sundays of Advent. Violet garments signify our penitent hope for salvation. The rose color, which may be worn on Advent's Third Sunday, signals that the season is nearly over – joy is at hand!"

"The wreath's most luminous symbol is its growing light. One candle is lit on the First Sunday of Advent; two on the Second, three on the Third and all four on the Fourth. In the northern hemisphere, Advent comes at a time when the days decrease to their shortest length. As the hours of darkness increase, we light more candles on the wreath. The wreath, which symbolizes the coming of Christ, grows in intensity as the anniversary of Jesus' birth draws near."

"The Advent wreath may be used at home or at church. It could be blessed on the First Sunday of Advent. When used in homes, the wreath could be blessed by a family member and lit during the evening meal, to remind everyone of the true meaning of this holy season." Fr. Paul Turner is the pastor of the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in Kansas City, Missouri and Director of the Office of Divine Worship for the Diocese of Kansas City-St Joseph. He holds a doctorate in Sacred Theology from Sant' Anselmo in Rome.

Friday of this week is December 8th, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Immaculate Conception is a Holy Day of Obligation. To honor this day, masses will be celebrated at 9:00 AM and 7:00 PM on December 8th. In this Advent Season – as we wait in joyful hope – let us be attentive to the coming of the Lord ,who is with us every day!

Ohioans can now receive a 100% tax credit of up to \$750 (\$1,500 for married couples filing jointly) for donations to the Angel Scholarship Fund. The aim of this tax-credit scholarship program is to award scholarships for elementary and high school students. This is a great opportunity to provide tuition assistance for families who wish to send their, children to our Catholic schools.

NEW in 2023!

HB 33 passed by the Ohio State legislature in July 2023, extended the scholarship tax credit deadline- donors now have until April 15, 2024 to make a contribution to the Angel Scholarship Fund that is eligible for a 1:1 state tax credit in 2023.


Brown Bag Lunch Series
