


# St. Joan of Arc Catholic Church

#### From the Pastor

Greetings of Peace this Second Sunday of Advent. Did you know that Christmas is 2-1/2 weeks away?!!

This column is being written on November 15 – much earlier than usual – because of my November travel schedule and there are early "due dates" for our bulletin because of deadlines from our "bulletin company," our Parish Office's schedule due to Thanksgiving, and the Thanksgiving holiday weekend...

I shared this last weekend, and am sharing it again, with a little more detail. Monday December 9th is a Holy Day of Obligation this year.

In 2024 (this weekend), December 8th is the Second Sunday of Advent, so the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception is transferred to Monday, December 9 (according to liturgical guidelines).

Previously, in the USA, when the date of the Immaculate Conception Holy Day was transferred to a Monday the obligation to attend mass was abrogated ("lifted").

This is longer true.

You see, earlier this year, Bishop Thomas J. Paprocki, Chairman of the US Bishops Committee on Canonical Affairs and Church Governance, wrote to Rome seeking clarification about the obligation to attend mass when a holy day of obligation in Advent, Lent, or Easter falls on Sunday and the Solemnity is transferred to Monday. In a recent memo to the US Bishops (dated Thursday, October 10) Bishop Paprocki communicated the Roman Dicastery for Legislative Texts response, which said, "The feast must be observed as a day of obligation on the day to which it is transferred."

In light of this new directive, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception on Monday, December 9, 2024 is to be observed as a Holy Day of Obligation.

I understand that local Bishops have the authority to dispense from the obligation to attend mass on a holyday of obligation. Here in the Diocese of Cleveland, Bishop Malesic did not do so for this feast/solemnity of December 9, 2024, and so it is a Holy Day of Obligation.

And so, here at St. Joan of Arc, masses on Monday December 9th will be celebrated at 9 AM and 7 PM, in observance of this Holy Day of Obligation.



Here is some other diocesan news from the Office for Child Protection, USCCB Charter Requirement. In our continued effort to comply with the requirements of the USCCB (US Bishops) Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, the Diocese of Cleveland Office for Protection of Children & Youth is asking parishes to publish the bulletin announcement below at least twice during the Audit period of July 1, 2024 – June 30, 2025. When published, parishes are asked to forward an electronic copy of the bulletin to diocese. Here at St. Joan of Arc, we will comply.

#### Protecting God's Children

The Diocese of Cleveland's "Protecting God's Children" program is a continuing effort to instruct and inform everyone about the protection of children from sexual abuse. To report any past or present suspected inappropriate behavior toward children by priests, deacons, religious, lay ecclesial ministers or personnel associated with the Church, immediately inform local authorities about inappropriate behavior. 
