

Greetings of Peace.



Greetings of Peace in the "middle of February." In just over one month we will enter springtime!

Last weekend we participated in the annual inpew process for Catholic Charities. Thank you for your willingness to "share God's

Transforming Love" and offer hope to those in need in NE Ohio. For those who have not yet completed a Catholic Charities envelope or made a pledge or gift, they are available in the Gathering Area of the church or the parish office. We can also support the good work of Catholic Charities by going to CATHOLICCOMMUNITY.org, texting the phrase CCHOPE to 41444, or using the QR code found on the Catholic Charities envelope. Thank you, again, for your support.

During Lent we will have "Stations of the Cross" on Fridays at 6:30 PM in church followed by a "soup supper" (for those who wish to participate).

Now that we are a few days into Lent, it might be good to review some church guidelines for this season. All Fridays in Lent, as well as Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, are days of Abstinence – which means all Catholics 14 years old and older are to Abstain from Meat.

Moreover, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are Days of Fast in addition to being days of Abstinence. Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are to Fast on both Ash Wednesday and Good Friday

How's this for a simple description of each?

- -Fasting means, "one full meal, two other light meals" and together, the "lighter meals" are not equivalent to the one main meal
- -Abstinence means "no meat"

It is prudent to remember there are cases and circumstances that excuse one from the obligations of Fast and/or Abstinence. Those who are "outside the age limits," those who may be physically or mentally ill – including individuals suffering from chronic illnesses – such as diabetes – are "exempt" from the "rules." Also excluded are pregnant or nursing women or others with physical needs, those who "exercise manual labor for a living," and such alike. In all cases, common sense should prevail, and no one should jeopardize their health by Fasting.

And, back by popular demand, here are some thoughts on "Keeping a Holy Lent" (an adaptation of Lenten Prayers and reflections by William Arthur Ward, 1921–1994, an American author, teacher and pastor). I have shared these in the past and have had numerous requests for them to be shared with you again. So, here goes!

Fast From ... and ... Feast On

Fast from judging others; feast on Christ in them.

Fast from wanting more; feast on being thankful.

Fast from anger; feast on patience.

Fast from worry; feast on trust.

Fast from complaining; feast on enjoyment.

Fast from negatives; feast on positives.

Fast from stress; feast on prayer.

Fast from anger; feast on forgiveness.

Fast from self-concern; feast on compassion for others.

Fast from fear; feast on truth.

Fast from discouragement; feast on hope.

Fast from gossip; feast on silence. Fast from fighting; feast on peace.

Be assured of my prayers for you - especially in this Holy Season of Lent.

Stay warm, safe, and well.





Lenten Book Study <u>The Liturgy: The Source and Summit of our Christian Life.</u>

<u> Monday 6:30-7:30 pm Rectory Basement</u>

The Catholic Church teaches that the celebration of the liturgy is the "source and summit of the Christian life" (Lumen gentium, 11). This easy-to-read resource explores what it means to call liturgy "source and summit." It will help the Catholic faithful to understand the meaning of the liturgy and its importance to our life of faith, experience Christ's fourfold presence in the various Church rites, come to a deeper relationship with God, and reflect on the transforming power of the liturgy to change the world.



Soup and Stations begin this week with Fr. Gary and I leading the Stations with Reflections from the book **Fatima the Way of the Cross** a booklet used on my pilgrimage to Fatima. Stations begin at 6:30pm followed by a soup supper.
