Greetings of Christmas Peace as we begin a New Year of Grace, 2023!

I hope your Christmas celebrations were blessed and joyful. And in the midst of Christmas, this weekend we honor Mary, the Mother of God, who said "yes" to bringing the world our Savior. We can also pray with St. Joseph, the father of Jesus and husband of Mary. Yes, the Holy Family is a model for us and our living!

In the church, we celebrate Christmas until the feast of the Baptism of the Lord. This year we will recall the Lord's baptism on Monday January 9, 2023. Until then, the church is festive with our Christmas decorations, we sing carols, and we rejoice at the dawning of our Salvation in the birth of Christ. Even though the stores have had everything on clearance for at least a week (or more!), we proclaim the birth of the Messiah and celebrate his presence and love! Again, Merry Christmas!

Therefore, please use the blessing we provide for you in next weekend's bulletin. Then gather as a family in any "main room" of your home and celebrate the "House Blessing Prayer." All you need is an open heart (and a piece of chalk, if you'd like to mark your doorpost!



The Book of the Apocalypse: A 'New' and uplifting 'Old Reading'

A new approach to the Book of Revelation looks back to the oldest interpretation we have, and discovers there a fresh reading. Surprisingly comforting and challenging at the same time, it displays a much more Christian sense of love and mercy than people often think.

Here's the key: everything in the Book of Revelation has already happened, is happening now, and will happen in the future.

Come and explore this ancient understanding on five **Monday evenings: January 9 and January 16, 23, 30, and Feb. 6 at 7 PM. in the Parish Hall.** Talks will be given by Rev. Gerald J. Bednar, Ph.D, former associate pastor at SJA., and last 60 minutes with time for discussion at the end of each lecture. The final session will feature live input from the Australian author of the new commentary, Rev. Francis Moloney, SDB.




