It is amazing that we are in the last part of the month of January. Wow! It feels like we just celebrated Christmas and began the New Year!

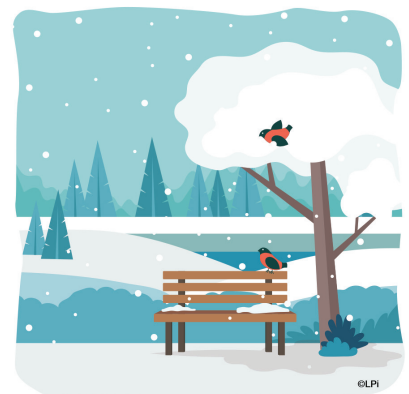
