

NOTES FROM DEACON DENNY

Summer is upon us. A great time of year to pause; perhaps reflecting on where we've been, plan some R&R, and contemplate the future. Over the last several months we have initialized a new regular program in our parish, Second Sunday Vespers. As the name implies, on the second Sunday of each month, we gather at 6:30 PM as a community of faith. Our normal protocol is to pray the Liturgy of the Hours; Vespers & Night Prayer, along with a brief "Ted Talk" on a relevant current topic, with a brief social time to follow. While we will be taking a break during the summer months, resuming in September, we continue to marvel at the wonderful consequences of praying together as community and opening up discussions on topics of current interest. A few of the recurring comments includes; "I'm beginning to pray at least one of the Liturgy of the Hours, every day." Also, "the 'Talk' tonight, really got me thinking." Our latest "Ted Talk" was from Mary Hrich, Dir. of the Office of Worship, here in the Diocese of Cleveland. The topic was the evolving Right of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA), evolving into a new Program soon to be introduced across the Country, from insights realized since the 1970's when it was begun. Much more to come in our coming weeks as we plan to evolve our program here at SJA.

Requests have already been received of where to find the materials to pray the Liturgy Of the Hours. "Of multiple "online" resources that are available at no cost, include; https://www.ebreviary.com/ Rumor has it, a number of folks may be meeting in that time slot, outdoors and praying the prayers, followed by some lemonade.



In The Garden with Tony Colini

Plants of the Week-June 10, 2024

Geranium species-Storksbill or Cranesbill

Plant Type: Herbaceous perennial that blooms in June.

Bloom: Pink to purple to white blooms long stems.

Culture: Partial shade to sun.

Biblical Connection: White Geranium was used as a bridal flower and represents Mary

as the bride of the Holy Spirit.

Where: In the GOL on the outer ring.



Plant Type: Herbaceous perennial that blooms end of may.

Bloom: White flowers along the plant stalks

Culture: Plant in shade to part shade

Biblical Connection: The marks on the root stalk resemble a ring or seal as in the seal of Solomon. The name Solomon

means "Beloved by God".

Where: In the Garden of Life along the entry walk.
