

From the Women's Guild





FUNERALS


Please contact the parish office before scheduling or publishing (generally through a funeral director).

In The Garden of Life with Toni Colini—May 12 2024

Mysotis scorpioides- Eyes of Mary (biennial Forget-me-not)

Plant Type: Biennial (blooms in second year and dies) easily reseeds itself throughout the garden, grows 8-10" in height, blooming in late April through May.

Bloom: Small pink to blue buds opening to tiny blue clusters of clear blue flowers with golden eye above the foliage.

Culture: Prefers semi-shade to shade, but does grow in full sun. This plant will grow in very wet conditions.

Marian Connection: The golden center of the Forget-me-not flower is the reflection of Jesus in paradise in Mary's blue eyes. The flower is to remind us of paradise, reflecting on Jesus as the center of life and hopes of everlasting life.

Where: In the entry walk to the Garden of Life on the right hand side and throughout the GOL.



Brunnera macrophylla- Eyes of Mary (perennial Forget-me-not)

Plant Type: Herbaceous perennial reaching a height of 18" blooming in late April to May.

Bloom: Small blue flower clusters above the heart shaped leaves.

Culture: Prefers shade to semi-shade growing in moist rich soils.

Marian Connection: The beautiful blue flowers remind us of Mary's eyes and the heart shaped

leaves of her love of God and servitude to him in giving birth to Jesus.

Where: In the entry walk to the Garden of Life on the right hand side.

Convallaria majalis- Mary's Tears (Lily of the Valley)

Plant Type: Herbaceous perennial groundcover, blooming in mid-May around Mother's day.

Bloom: Small, fragrant, tear drop shaped white flowers along stems about 8" tall.

Culture: Grows in dry to moist shade, forming a dense mat of rich green ground cover.

Biblical Connection: Legend says that as Mary stood at the foot of the cross her tears fell to

the

ground and turned to these tiny fragrant blossoms. The lily of the valley is a symbol of the Virgin Mary's purity as white flowers, sweet fragrance, and humility. The plant symbolizes Mary's Immaculate Conception as purity of body and soul.

Where: In the entry walk to the Garden of Life on the right hand side.
