

#### In The Garden of Life with Toni Colini—May 5, 2024

#### **Cornus florida- Dogwood tree**

Plant Type: Ornamental flowering tree of about 25-30' native to Ohio
Bloom: Blooms in May with white, pink, red flowers depending on the cultivar type.
Culture: This tree likes a loamy well drained soil with plenty of compost and it likes partial shade. It's a woods edge or understory tree.
Biblical/ Marian Connection: See the poem below.

**Where:** In the Garden of Life on the right hand side as you begin the rosary.



#### A Legend of the Dogwood Tree

When Christ was on earth, the dogwood grew to a towering size with a lovely hue. It's branches were strong and interwoven and for Christ's cross it's timbers were chosen. Being distressed at the use of this wood, Christ made a promise which still holds true.

"Not ever again shall the dogwood grow To be large enough for such a tree, and so Slender and twisted it shall always be With cross-shaped blossoms for all to see. The petals shall have bloodstains marked in brown And in the blossoms center a thorny crown. All who see it will think of me, Nailed to a cross from a dogwood tree. Protected and cherished this tree shall be A reflection to all of my agony." by Alan Grant

Pulsatilla vulgaris- Pasch flower

**Plant Type:** Herbaceous perennial with silvery, fuzzy fernlike foliage. **Bloom:** Blooms in May on short stems with varieties of colors of passion purple, red, and white **Culture:** Not a difficult perennial to grow, tolerant of many conditions, prefers well drained soils and grows best in full sun to partial shade.

**Biblical/ Marian Connection:** Anemos is Greek for wind. This plant would have grown on the dryer windy sites such as the Galilee area where Jesus grew up. Anemone would probably be one of the flowers referred to as the "Lilies of the field". (Matthew 6:28-29; Luke 12:27-28). Pasque refers to Passover and Easter.

Where: In the Garden of Life in the center quadrants.
