


# St. Joan of Arc Catholic Church

# From the Pastor

Greetings of Peace in mid-November – and this week we begin the "final part" of November. Time flies! Before long it will be Thanksgiving, Advent, Christmas, and then the New Year 2025.



Here is an update on our Stewardship Appeal to enhance our Offertory – since the "formal phase" of

this effort is concluding. It is very clear to me that St. Joan of Arc Parish is truly blessed. You have been so generous with your sacrificial giving of time, talent, and treasure in response to our Stewardship Appeal and in "serving" our parish. This speaks of our continuing gratitude for God's gifts. And with God's help we will continue to grow in discipleship. So far, we have received over 210 replies; 2/3 have shared an increase with a total of just over \$4,000 per week – and more replies are coming in. May God continue to bless us as we share in His work! You are a gift. I am very grateful.



We are in the midst of Cold & Flu season – and the medical community tells us that cases are becoming a bit more prevalent. Moreover, CoVid is not done with us. CoVid variants are popping up. And there is now RSV (Respiratory Syncytial Virus), especially among the very young and some of our "seniors" as well.

It is prudent that if you are feeling ill, please take appropriate precautions so as to not spread any "bugs" around. Those who are sick should please stay home! Missing church due to illness is "not a sin." It is better to stay at home rather than coming to church when one is sick. Not spreading the germs is an act of faith and kindness to us all! Thank you.

We were all taught that covering the mouth and nose with a tissue or handkerchief while coughing or sneezing – this can help prevent the spread of any illness. Be sure to dispose of any used tissues and maintain hygiene around the home, at church, in the car, etc. Another sensible step is to get vaccines, which could reduce the burden on health services, stay more healthy, and help each of us reduce the spread and infection of diseases that can spread.

There are other steps we could consider here at church, especially for those who may be "at higher risk." Some may choose not to shake hands. Instead, we could offer a "reverential bow" to each other at the Rite of Peace at mass. Some have chosen to wear masks. It is always good advice to regularly wash hands and use sanitizer as well. Let's be vigilant, prudent, and practical.

Stay well, warm, and faithful. Here's to our health!




