From the Pastor



Greetings of Peace.

This column is being written on November 9 – much earlier than usual – since I will be out of town and because of early "due dates" for our bulletin, deadlines from our "bulletin company" and of our Parish Office's schedule, Thanksgiving, and the Thanksgiving holiday weekend...

Each year in the fall, all churches in the Catholic Diocese of Cleveland do "A Count." This "count" also takes place in most of the USA. It is a good indicator to see how many Catholics are practicing their faith by attending mass. Here is some of my reflections on our recent "October Count."

In the past few years, the mass attendance numbers at St. Joan of Arc have trended downward. This is also the case in some areas of our diocese, Ohio, in the USA, as well as other countries. Still, by looking at the numbers, below, we see there are fewer people attending mass (on average) here at SJA this year than there were as recently as 5 years ago, before the pandemic.

Average attendance per weekend at St. Joan of Arc

This year, 2024, the average attendance per mass was: Sat 4:30 #200, Sun 9 AM #175, Sun 11 AM #275

*Note: The numbers from the year 2020 are much lower because of the CoVid pandemic, the fact that the bishop's dispensation from the obligation to attend mass was still in effect, the pandemic was still reflecting surging numbers of CoVid cases, and many public safety protocols were still mandated. The year 2020 was particularly low. The numbers were also lower in 2021 and 2022.

The above trends show some realties that must be faced -- and it seems to me that these are quite significant. Mass attendance impacts the vibrancy of our parish, our collections, it is evidenced in the fact that we now have one priest at St. Joan (when about 10 years ago we had two "full time" priests), and also impacts the number of people in our parish who are available to participate in ministries, groups, committees, support our school and enrollment, and so on.

Now St. Joan of Arc is not unique in this matter -- it is reflected in many parts of the USA. Still, the trend is very interesting. I wonder what this says about how Catholics are committed to the faith? Recent studies have shown about 25% of Catholics attend mass on a regular basis -- and that was before the pandemic. Other studies have shown even less come to mass, now. Additionally, studies have shown that those who do come are not very involved in the life of the church. Can it be we don't think attendance and participation at mass is important? Or we grew "too comfortable" not coming to church, or when we did participate during the pandemic we enjoyed doing church" in our pajamas and with our coffee as we watched on our computers?

In the Diocese of Cleveland, we ordained 6 men as priests in the spring of 2023. In 2024 we had one (1) man ordained a priest. This coming year, 2025, we will ordain 8. (We have been averaging 4.25 ordinations per year over the last 15 years in our Diocese.) In You know as well as I do that there are many more priests than that who will, retire, die, or otherwise be not able to do ministry in the next year. In coming years (after 2025), the numbers of ordinations do not seem to be as high. Let me ask this: If what we do in church (with mass, sacraments, baptisms, funerals, weddings, etc.) is important to us as Catholics, then who will be the ones to do this priestly work in the future? I know I am not able to do what I did in my 30's, 40's and 50's now that I am in my mid-60's. Not too long ago, I asked a retired priest to help here at St. Joan of Arc and he told me "I think the 'middle-aged clergy' are being worked to death and they need all the help they can get... I will help when I can; but for me, at over age 80, I don't know what I can continue to do... or what you will be able to continue to do...." Again, I wanted to communicate all this to you -- in light of our recent October count. I offer it for your perusal!

Thank you for your faith -- and for your presence -- here at St. Joan of Arc.

Please note, I am away from the parish, on vacation. I will return for masses on Sunday December 1. While I am away there will not be daily mass at St. Joan of Arc. Fr. Andrew Morkunas will cover confessions and all the parish masses this weekend, November 23-24. He will also be here for 315 confessions and 430 mass on Saturday November 30. Also note – this week there will not be a "daily mass" here at St. Joan, since I am away. The priests of our neighboring parishes will do their best to cover any emergencies or funerals at St. Joan while I am away. Thank you, Fathers. Our parish staff will also be of service. They are good! I look forward to seeing you when I return and we begin Advent!

This weekend in church we celebrate the Feast of "Christ the King." Here is a reflection by Fr. Paul Turner

"Jesus Christ is king of all creation. At the end of Matthew's Gospel, Jesus tells his disciples that all authority in heaven and on earth has been given to him (28/18). The Revelation of John calls him King of kings and Lord of lords (19:16). People wanted to make Jesus a king after he worked the miracle of the loaves, but he went away by himself instead (Jn 6/15). They wanted a secular king to govern their land. Jesus wanted to rule their hearts.

"The Catholic Church celebrates the kingship of Christ on the last Sunday of the church year. The liturgical year reaches its climax in a celebration that honors the supreme command of Christ. He has dominion over all creation, and he rules every person who believes in him.

"The feast of Christ the King entered the Catholic calendar in 1925, which Pope Pius XI had set aside as a holy year. Pius thought the feast would bring the year to a solemn close, help combat the forces of secularism, and remind the world that Christ is its ultimate ruler. The pope chose the last Sunday of October because of its proximity to the end of the liturgical year and to serve as a prelude to All Saints Day on Nov. 1. The same day was already being observed as Reformation Sunday in the Protestant traditions.

"Pope Paul VI moved the observance from the end of October to the very last Sunday of the church year in order to exalt its theme even more. Now we end the year with an idea that sums up all that we have celebrated and that prepares us to start anew: this Jesus, whose birth we will soon celebrate, is the king of all creation."
