### **From the Pastor**

Greetings of Peace this last week of November.

This weekend we conclude "Ordinary Time" in the church year and look to the beginning of Advent.

Please note: This column is being written in early November because of the Thanksgiving holiday, early due dates from our bulletin company and our parish office, and my recent travels.

As we "round out" another church year we celebrate "Christ, the King."

As Fr. Paul Turner tells us about this feast, "Jesus Christ is king of all creation. At the end of Matthew's Gospel, Jesus tells his disciples that all authority in heaven and on earth has been given to him (28/18). The Revelation of John calls him King of kings and Lord of lords (19:16). People wanted to make Jesus a king after he worked the miracle of the loaves, but he went away by himself instead (Jn 6/15). They wanted a secular king to govern their land. Jesus wanted to rule their hearts.

"The Catholic Church celebrates the kingship of Christ on the last Sunday of the church year. The liturgical year reaches its climax in a celebration that honors the supreme command of Christ. He has dominion over all creation, and he rules every person who believes in him.

"The feast of Christ the King entered the Catholic calendar in 1925, which Pope Pius XI had set aside as a holy year. Pius thought the feast would bring the year to a solemn close, help combat the forces of secularism, and remind the world that Christ is its ultimate ruler. The pope chose the last Sunday of October because of its proximity to the end of the liturgical year and to serve as a prelude to All Saints Day on Nov. 1. The same day was already being observed as Reformation Sunday in the Protestant traditions.

"Pope Paul VI moved the observance from the end of October to the very last Sunday of the church year in order to exalt its theme even more. Now we end the year with an idea that sums up all that we have celebrated and that prepares us to start anew: this Jesus, whose birth we will soon celebrate, is the king of all creation.

#### **NEW OPPORTUNITY TO SUPPORT OUR STUDENTS!**

Ohioans can now receive a 100% tax credit of up to \$750 (\$1,500 for married couples filing jointly) for donations to the Angel Scholarship Fund. The aim of this tax-credit scholarship program is to award scholarships for elementary and high school students. This is a great opportunity to provide tuition assistance for families who wish to send their, children to our Catholic schools.

#### **NEW in 2023!**

HB 33 passed by the Ohio State legislature in July 2023, extended the scholarship tax credit deadline- donors now have until April 15, 2024 to make a contribution to the Angel Scholarship Fund that is eligible for a 1:1 state tax credit in 2023.

# **Office of Faith Formation**


