

From the Pastor

Greetings of Peace in the month of November. This weekend, November 4-5 we turn our clocks back one hour. On Saturday before bedtime we "Fall Back." I like to say "we spin our clocks' as we leave Daylight Savings Time." Someone recently said, "I thought we were done turning our clocks and we would stay on one time all-year-round." I did some checking and here is what I found. Many states continue to consider proposals to adopt either permanent daylight saving time or permanent standard time. Yet, no states have adopted a legislative change in 2023. Without new movement on proposed changes, Americans should expect clock changes to continue into 2024. This time change will last until the second Sunday of March 2024, when daylight saving time starts again. So there you have it. Ohio has not yet adopted a legislative change, so we will continue to "change our clocks."

And, in church, November is the month we remember the Faithful Departed. Our parish "Book of Remembrance" is in the Gathering Area of the church in November. Parishioners are invited to inscribe the names of our departed loved ones in the book and we will remember them in a special way in our prayers in November.

Additionally, we will remember those whose funerals or memorials we had at St. Joan of Arc this past year at our 4:30 PM mass on Saturday November 4th. "Eternal rest grant to them, 0 Lord." Amen. We are all on our journey to the kingdom of God – the Faithful Departed, the Faithful Present (that's us!), and the "Faithful yet to come" are one in faith and called to be united in God's love.

And this week, we vote on Tuesday – for those who "go to the polls". (I already voted.) —Please vote!

-Secondly, we should allow our faith influence us as we form our consciences and become informed on issues – and candidates...

-Also note, the Church does not support or oppose particular candidates; the church does seek to focus attention on the moral and human dimensions of issues.

We have been asked to include this bulletin announcement this weekend by the Ohio Bishops (Catholic Conference of Ohio) and Bishop Malesic...

This Tuesday, the rights and safety of women, children, and parents are on the ballot. Issue 1 not only puts women at risk and threatens parental rights, but this extreme amendment also allows abortions through all nine months of pregnancy. The vague language of Issue 1 endangers preborn children and Catholics cannot be silent when the most vulnerable are in harm's way.

Catholics must Vote NO on Issue 1 because it endangers children by...

-Allowing abortion through all nine months by using the overly broad term "health" to permit painful, late-term abortions. In U.S. law, "health" includes age, as well as psychological, emotional, or physical well-being, so an abortion providing-physician could justify an abortion in the third trimester by citing a woman's age or emotional well-being.

-Leaving preborn children without protection by giving abortion providers the ability to determine on a "case by case" basis when a preborn child is protected by state laws. If abortion-providing physicians can decide when a preborn child is viable, this allows the same clinician to sidestep regulations and end the lives of potentially viable children.

Our Catholic faith teaches us that every human being deserves protection, love, and care – especially the most vulnerable. This Tuesday, to defend the preborn from painful, late-term abortions and to protect children in the womb, Vote NO on Issue 1.

Ohioans can now receive a 100% tax credit of up to \$750 (\$1,500 for married couples filing jointly) for donations to the Angel Scholarship Fund. The aim of this tax-credit scholarship program is to award scholarships for elementary and high school students. This is a great opportunity to provide tuition assistance for families who wish to send their, children to our Catholic schools.

NEW in 2023!

HB 33 passed by the Ohio State legislature in July 2023, extended the scholarship tax credit deadline- donors now have until April 15, 2024 to make a contribution to the Angel Scholarship Fund that is eligible for a 1:1 state tax credit in 2023.



BUILDING COMMON GROUND NOTES FROM DEACON DENNY

What is Second Sunday Vespers at SJA and who can we bring along?

Second Sunday Vespers at SJA, which will occur every month on the second Sunday of the Month, has 4 parts:

- Evening Prayer (Vespers) ~ 20 minutes
- Brief Presentation (Ted Talk) ~ 9-10 minutes plus brief Q&A
- Social Time (Cookies & Beverages)
- Closing Prayer (w/ Blessing) ~5 minutes

Evening Prayer is the Prayer of the church where as a Community we recite and sing the Evening Prayer, as prayed around the world for that day.

Brief Presentation will be a short presentation on a selected topic pertinent to the community, with a different speaker every Month, selected by the community.

Social Time is a time to meet and greet, and connect with others. A place to bring people together as our Faith Based Community, as a welcoming back, or meeting a new person of interest.

Closing Prayer, Night Prayer of the church is a brief prayer, at the closing of the day, where as a community we pray for continued blessings on ourselves and our communities and are sent with a special Blessing for our families and our lives.

Who should we invite? Second Sunday Vespers is open to everyone, parishioners, family members (Catholic & non-Catholic), neighbors, friends & associates of all faiths It is a time to build a welcoming community, to meet or greet a friend, to introduce others to our faith community.
