From the Pastor

Greetings of Peace this **first weekend of October**. The Fall colors are supposed to become more vibrant this week into next week – although the weather and drought will have an impact on their "brightness," I am told.

We are in the midst of our **Parish Stewardship Appeal**, asking for your support in **enhancing our Offertory Collections.** I give a **heartfelt "Thank you"** for your openness and generous support.

Here are some STEWARDSHIP REFLECTIONS: RESOLUTIONS

Each year, people throughout the world make New Year's resolutions. For many, these resolutions are short lived and quickly forgotten. At our Baptism and Confirmation, we made New Life resolutions. Our baptismal promises are lifelong commitments to Jesus and the Church.

We recognize that all that we possess comes from God. We are God's stewards. We have been empowered to manage the abundant gifts that we have received.

As "good stewards," it is our responsibility to give back a portion of the time, talent and treasure we receive from our generous and loving God. Let us recommit ourselves to the Lord by taking the time to plan. Let us make stewardship of time and talent part of our lifestyle, and stewardship of treasure part of our budget.

"Each must do as already determined, without sadness or compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver." (II Cor 9/7)

And here is a STEWARDSHIP APPEAL UPDATE

Follow-up letters from me will be mailed to all households from whom we have not yet received a response to our Stewardship Appeal. We would appreciate it if you could please respond as soon as you are able by placing your intention card in the collection basket or dropping it off at the parish office. Thank you. I will also offer regular updates at our weekend masses. Those who have replied should receive a note from me offering my thanks!

We are about a month away from the November election. We have been bombarded with ads and partisan politics for the past year...and more. Please note what the US Bishops have said, "We strongly urge all parishioners to register to vote, to become informed on key issues, and to vote."

And further, The Church does not support or oppose any particular candidate, but seeks to focus attention on the moral and human dimensions of issues. Moreover, we do not authorize the distribution of partisan political materials on parish property.

In summary, because we are people of faith, let us allow our faith to influence our thoughts and actions – including how we vote. As above, St. Joan of Arc does not permit leafleting of any kind nor placing flyers (or any other partisan materials) on vehicles or on parish property at any time. Anyone who might do so is not acting in the name of the parish or with the authorization of our church or diocese.

Finally, Here is an important note. **This week, the priests of the diocese of Cleveland will gather for a convocation from Tuesday October 8 until Friday October 11, 2024.** Since I will be participating the convocation, I will not be at the parish those days. As a result, we will not have daily mass at St. Joan of Arc on Thursday or Friday of this week. This "extended convocation" takes place every other year. Please keep the priests of the Diocese of Cleveland in your prayers as we gather for this convocation and time of being together. I will remember you!

Are you interested, or do you know anyone who is interested, in learning the Catholic faith and in joining the Catholic Church? The Rite (Order) of Christian Initiation Of Adults (R/OCIA) accomplishes just that, and we have been providing this process each year typically from October to the Easter Vigil Mass in the following year. We invite anyone interested to inquire about this wonderful journey into God's gift of faith. We anticipate regular sessions starting in early October. Sessions are held typically once a week in the rectory meeting room from 6:30 to 8:00 pm in the evening, for adults. We also have separate sessions for "teens" and grade school children needing to prepare for sacraments as well. Respect Life Sunday



In October, the Catholic Church in the United States celebrates Respect Life Month, and the first Sunday of October is designated as Respect Life Sunday. Please join the Geauga County Catholic Pro-Life Coalition (H.E.L.P.) at their annual Life Chain Rally at the corner of RT. 306 and RT 322 on Oct. 6 from 1pm-2pm. Parking is available at

Parkside Park which is adjacent to the Life Chain event. Bring your rosaries and join us as we pray for the spiritual health and well-being of those facing a crisis pregnancy and especially for babies whose lives are at risk because of abortion.

How would you best describe "being Catholic", and/or practicing our Faith? Your Sacramental Certificates, the list of classes and courses along with your academics growing up, regular attendance at Church functions and practices on the annual liturgical calendar? What would you add to this list? Recent Popes have suggested considering a purposeful and ongoing need for continuing growth or maturation of Head, Heart & Hands, partially defined as; Catechetical study, Spiritual Development and Charitable actions. The new Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA), details "rites" and practices for one on a journey of faith toward becoming a Catholic with the reception of the Sacraments of Initiation, while experiencing sacramentals, catechesis and spiritual guidance along the way. This typically is coupled with Scripture study, developing a prayer life, participating with your gifts in a community, companioning and/or mentoring others in our Christian faith Tradition, and seeking to define your personal spirituality. Albeit there is no simple recipe. It is truly part of all of our ongoing Faith Journeys.

One of the these ongoing developments is a new single volume book, **This Is Our Faith: A Catholic Catechism for Adults** by Michael Pennock (Author) widely used in our diocese as a starting point for review or beginning your Faith journey. We are looking in the coming weeks to add other "points of entry" into new discovery for enrichment or discerning a potential journey with our team at SJA. We are open to discussion of questions or potential meetings in person or on zoom to chat about these topics.
