

From the Pastor



Greetings of Peace in this season of Fall. The colors and foliage are nearing their peak, according to the Ohio Department of Natural Resources. I enjoy this time of year.

The Ohio Bishops and Bishop Malesic have asked all parishes in our Diocese and the State of Ohio to share these words with you this weekend.

By now, you have likely heard about Issue 1, the proposed amendment to enshrine abortion into the Ohio Constitution. This communication is to share a bit more about this extreme amendment and what we can do to help protect the women, families, and children of Ohio.

While some believe Issue 1 would simply restore Ohio back to the pre-Dobbs decision days, this proposed amendment goes DANGEROUSLY BEYOND what was legalized in the Roe v. Wade ruling. If passed, this amendment would:

 Open the door to remove health and safety standards that protect women seeking an abortion;

—Threaten parental rights, as the language directly conflicts with current requirements for parental notification and consent before a child under 18 can obtain an abortion;

-And allow for abortions in the third trimester, well beyond when a baby feels pain.

Issue 1 is too extreme for Ohio. We need your help to ensure this scary amendment does not find a home in our constitution, making it very difficult to change. So, what can you do?

First – if you are not already registered to vote, REGISTER TODAY! The deadline to register is this Tuesday, October 10th. You can register online at **www.voteohio.gov**

Next – please VOTE NO on Issue 1. Early and absentee voting begins this Wednesday, October 11th. Again, you can visit **www.voteohio.gov** to request your absentee ballot or find your early voting location.

Finally – Pray, visit the Ohio Catholic Conference website to learn more about Issue 1, and tell your family and friends about the extreme implications of Issue 1 and encourage them to Vote No!

(The Catholic Conference of Ohio serves as the official voice of the Catholic Church in Ohio on matters of public policy).

Sacrament of Matrimony: Please contact a priest or deacon at least one year before the anticipated date.

Angel Scholarship Fund- Back in 2023!

The Angel Scholarship Fund (ASF) is a State of Ohio approved Scholarship Granting Organization. Donors to ASF may be eligible for a 100% tax credit on their State of Ohio income tax return for the year the contribution is made. ASF donations are awarded as tuition assistance for K-12 students in the Diocese of Cleveland, and donors may designate a school/schools to receive their donation.

Here's how it works*:

The maximum credit amount is \$750 per individual; married couples that file a joint return can each claim this credit if both spouses make eligible donations (\$1,500 total). **Please note this is a non-refundable credit, which means that the amount of the credit cannot exceed the amount owed in state taxes.** Just follow these three steps:

- STEP 1- Estimate your 2023 Ohio state tax liability
- STEP 2- Make your donation to ASF
- STEP 3- Claim your scholarship tax credit when you file your 2023 State of Ohio taxes

* This does not constitute income tax advice. Always consult with a tax professional for information on the impact of any charitable donation.

Early Voting Against Issues 1 & 2

We have been asked to include this bulletin announcement this weekend by the bishops

Catholics are called to faithful citizenship, which means we must act when a moral question confronts our society by praying and fasting, educating ourselves and our neighbors, and making our voice heard when it's time to vote.

As followers of Christ, Catholics cannot be silent when the health and safety of women and preborn children are endangered by the vague language of Issue 1. We must also protect the health of children and safety of our communities, which are both threatened by the legalization of recreational marijuana proposed by Issue 2. Recreational marijuana puts children at risk by increasing exposure to harmful drugs when their development is most vulnerable. It also increases the likelihood of traffic fatalities and workplace accidents.

October is designated by the Catholic Church as the "Month of the Rosary" because in this month the Church celebrates the Marian advocation of "Our Lady of the Rosary" on Oct. 7.

The dedication of the month of October to the Holy Rosary became common in the Church thanks to Pope Leo XIII, an enthusiastic promoter of the rosary. In the span of only five years, Pope Leo wrote eleven encyclicals on the rosary.

St. John Paul II called the rosary his favorite prayer, "in which we meditate with Mary upon the mysteries which she as a Mother meditated on in her heart (Lk. 2:19.)."

The Mysteries of the Rosary

Until about the 15th century hundreds of mysteries were part of the Rosary devotion. Then the 15 mysteries that we know today were definitively fixed as "the Mysteries of the Rosary." Pope John Paul II, in his encyclical, Rosarium Virginis Mariae, in 2002 added the five Luminous Mysteries.

Through the meditations of the complete Rosary one recalls and has impressed on his mind, the Popes tell us, "the chief mysteries of the Christian religion," "the mysteries of our Redemption," "the great mysteries of Jesus and His Mother united in joys, sorrows, and triumphs." The twenty mysteries are divided into four equal groups, known as "The Joyful," "The Sorrowful," "The Glorious," and "The Luminous Mysteries."
