## From the Pastor

**Greetings of Peace.** 



Note: This column is being written earlier than usual because of deadlines from our bulletin company, the parish office, and since it is the "Labor Day "holiday weekend."

This weekend we enter the month of September. According to the "official calendar" we still have a few weeks of summer left to enjoy. This year the Season of Fall will officially start on September 22 – with the arrival of the autumnal equinox. In "meteorological circles," though, September 1 is the beginning of fall. "Meteorological seasons" are based on the annual temperature cycle. So September, October, and November are known as "Meteorological Fall." Meteorological Summer, for example, would run June through August – the hottest months of the year. Of course, the "coldest months of the year are December, January, and February. That would be "Meteorological Winter." Regardless of which "calendar" we follow to "mark" the Seasons, we see we are "losing more daylight" as we move through September. The Seasons are a great gift and I hope we all enjoy God's creation and gifts God gives to us in nature.

Now that we are in September, here is a reminder about our "daily mass" for Tuesdays. Each year, beginning in September (and after Labor Day), the Tuesday morning daily mass in our parish will be at 9 AM. (In the "summer months of June, July, and August the Tuesday daily mass is 8 AM. In September through May the daily mass on Tuesdays is 9 AM. Our parish Day School will join us for mass on most Tuesdays. Thank you for making a note of this!

Monday of this week, September 2, is Labor Day. Our morning mass on Labor Day is 9:00 AM on this civic holiday.

Here is a note about "Labor Day." The US Department of Labor says, "Observed the first Monday in September, Labor Day is an annual celebration of the social and economic achievements of American workers. The holiday is rooted in the late nineteenth century when labor activists pushed for a federal holiday to recognize the many contributions workers have made to America's strength, prosperity, and well-being."

And Pope John Paul II wrote about "human work" in his 1981 encyclical "Laborem Exercens." The Holy Father encouraged all of us to look at all the various "works" we do in our lives as a way to share in the work of God and "building the Kingdom" here on earth. In essence, it is our "work" to renew the face of the earth and reflect God's goodness and love. I say, "Amen."



Finally, next Sunday afternoon, September 8, is our **Parish Festival-Picnic** is the afternoon of Sunday, September 8. All are welcome! Come and enjoy! It is also the beginning the football season for the **Cleveland Browns**, who begin their year with a game at 4:30 PM.

To receive the sacrament of Eucharist in 2ndgrade, two years of regular religious education are required. Therefore, if you have a child entering 1st grade this school year, please make sure to register him/her in our SJA Parish School of Religion for the 2024-2025 school year.


To receive the sacrament of Confirmation in 8th grade, two years of regular religious education are required. Therefore, if you have a child entering 7th grade this school year, please make sure to register him/her in our SJA Parish School of Religion for the 2024-2025 school year. For Confirmation in 8th grade, in addition to attendance of a regular religious education class, attendance in our supplemental Confirmation preparation program will be required.

If your child attends a Catholic school, they do not need to attend our PSR classes, however, for Confirmation as an 8th grader, they will need to register for our Confirmation preparation program only.

#### **NOTES FROM DEACON DENNY**

Over the last several weeks we have been talking about our Faith Journey as something that never stops. Here at SJA we are expanding our Right of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA), newly updated to OCIA, with new options and programs.

Historically we have had an adult catechesis program starting in the fall for adults, most recently led by Deacon Jeff. Additionally, we have specialized preparation for teen formation leading to the Sacraments, and individualized sacramental preparation for grade school students joining our faith community having missed some or all of the appropriate preparation.

This year we are expanding to include some new options;

- \* Inquirer sessions, individual or small group, in exploring our faith our Traditions, issues of returning to Church or seeking general information without any commitment or expectation....just discovery.(information only)
- \* Interest in exploring steps needed on an individual or family basis for joining the Catholic Church.
- \* Signing up for our newly forming cohort for RCIA for the coming year.
- \* Joining our team as; companions, sponsors, or just "tagging along"
- \* Interest in forming a faith sharing group;

  - o Starting a small group in Discovering Spirituality
