

From the Pastor

Greetings of Peace.



Note: This column is being written much earlier than usual because of bulletin deadlines and Monday of this past week being Labor Day. At any rate, here it is!

Now that we are past Labor Day, school is in full swing. Our Parish School of Religion (PSR) is readying to begin and so are the preparations for the "sacramental sessions" for those who will received Penance, Confirmation, and First Eucharist this "academic year." And the Cleveland Browns begin their new season this Sunday, September 10. So, too, is our St. Joan of Arc parish festival (picnic)!

Here is a reminder – since we are now in September, the parish "Daily mass" on Tuesdays will be at 9 AM throughout the school year so our parish school can join us most Tuesdays. Thank you for making a note of this!

This weekend, all parishes in our diocese and in the State of Ohio are asked Bishops of Ohio to introduce a "54 Day Novena" in anticipation of the November election in which we can choose to uphold and defend life...We will communicate Information from the bishops in our bulletins, on the parish and diocesan websites, on tables in the Gathering Area, and perhaps more. The bishop ask us, "Pray for Life. Support Life. Take a stand for Life."

To participate in the 54 day Novena, we pray a rosary each day from now until election day "for life." See the following link https://catholicaoc.org/pray54ohio/

Finally, let me reiterate the "policy" in our diocese (for over 4 years) about our "Posture at mass." We should remain standing after the Lamb of God, throughout the distribution and reception of Holy Communion and the singing of the Communion Hymn. When the distribution of Holy Communion to the faithful has been completed we may sit or kneel for private prayer. It is understood, though, that individual members of the faithful who may not be able to stand or kneel for a period of time because of health reasons or physical limitations may do what is best for themselves and their circumstances.

In sum, during the mass we assume different postures – standing, kneeling, sitting – and we make a variety of gestures as well. These postures and gestures are not merely ceremonial. They have profound meaning. The Church sees in these common postures and gestures both a symbol of the unity of those who have come together to worship and also a means of fostering that unity.

The bishop said we should not change these postures to suit our own individual preference or piety. The Church makes it clear that our unity of posture and gesture is an expression that we are indeed the one Body of Christ, united in body, mind, spirit, and voice. I say, "Amen."

Funerals: Please contact the parish office before scheduling or publishing (generally through a funeral director).



NOTES FROM JON THIBO:



St. Joan of Arc Music Ministry will be forming a new Children's Choir for Parish Masses one Sunday each month at 11 a.m. Mass. Students in our PSR and Day School graded 2-8 are encouraged to attend rehearsal starting Tuesday September 19 from 4:30-5:30 in the church with Mr. Jon Thibo, Director of Music.

Student Cantors for our Day School Masses will still meet on Wednesday right after school until 4 p.m. in the church to prepare for those weekly Masses. Students in grades 5-8 are encouraged to participate starting Wednesday September 13.

Our Adult Choir will resume rehearsal on Tuesday September 5 from 7-9 p.m. in the church, and New Members will be welcomed, especially in the Tenor/Baritone section. High School and College Students are very welcome here! You can join through the month of September, not just the first night, so please consider sharing your time and talent so that this vibrant part of our liturgical celebrations here at our parish continues to grow.

A new Handbell Choir is forming as well, high school students through adults are welcome and an ability to read music, while helpful, is not necessary. Rehearsal will be Monday September 16 from 7-9, come get acquainted with Handbells and how to ring them to add more beauty to our liturgy. The goal will be to ring one Mass per month at 11 a.m. as well as Christmas, Holy Week and Easter Sunday.

Resurrection Catholic Church:

Resurrection Catholic Parish in Solon is beginning L.E.A.F. ministry for those who have a loved one who is incarcerated – Listening, Encouraging, Assisting Families of the incarcerated. It is said that "When a loved one goes to prison, the whole family goes to prison." Family and friends of the incarcerated often experience isolation, shame, and guilt. They have questions about the system and the way it works. They fear for their loved one. L.E.A.F. offers support, comfort, and information to help address the difficulties these families and friends face. The monthly meetings are open to all people irrespective of faith affiliation. They are confidential and there is no fee involved.

The first meeting will be Monday, November 13 at 7 PM at Church of the Resurrection in Solon, OH.
