

From the Pastor

Greetings of Peace.

This week is Labor Day on Monday, September 4, 2023. Our "daily mass" on Labor Day is at 9 AM. The US Department of Labor says, "Observed the first Monday in September, Labor Day is an annual celebration of the social and economic achievements of American workers. The holiday is rooted in the late nineteenth century, when labor activists pushed for a federal holiday to recognize the many contributions workers have made to America's strength, prosperity, and well-being."

And Pope John Paul II wrote about "human work" in his 1981 encyclical "Laborem Exercens." The Holy Father encourages all of us to look at all the various "works" we do in our lives as a way to share in the work of God and "building the Kingdom" here on earth. In essence, it is our "work" to renew the face of the earth. Amen. We have been in the month of September for a few days, already! According to the "official calendar" we still have a few weeks of summer left to enjoy. This year I believe the Season of Fall will officially start on Saturday September 23 – with the arrival of the autumnal equinox. In "meteorological circles," though, September 1 is the beginning of fall. "Meteorological seasons" are based on the annual temperature cycle. So September, October, and November are known as "Meteorological Fall." Meteorological Summer, for example, would run June through August – the hottest months of the year. Of course, the "coldest months of the year are December, January, and February. That would be "Meteorological Winter." Regardless of which "calendar" we follow to "mark" the Seasons, we see we are "losing more daylight" as we move through September. The Seasons are a great gift and I hope we all enjoy God's creation and gifts God gives to us in nature.

The Catholic Conference of Ohio (CCO, the Ohio Bishops) and Bishop Malesic in our diocese are "urging all Catholics to learn about the dangers of the Proposition 1 amendment on abortion and encourage them to vote no..." In addition, we can pray a 54-Day Novena, invoking 54 different saints to intercede in the cause to defeat the amendment on abortion.

—What: A Rosary each day for 27 days in petition; then immediately a Rosary each day for 27 days in Thanksgiving

-When: September 15 (Our Lady of Sorrows) to November 7 (Election Day) The bishops have said that all of us are encouraged to vote (and register to vote, for those who are not registered). Moreover our faith can influence us as we form our consciences and seek to become informed on issues – and candidates. Also note, the Church does not support or oppose particular candidates; the church does seek to focus attention on the moral and human dimensions of issues.

Finally, since we are in the month of September, please note that the "daily mass" in the parish on Tuesdays will be celebrated at 9 AM throughout the school year. In June, July, and August, the Tuesday morning mass is 8 AM. During the "academic year," for the months of September through May, we shift the time our Tuesday mass to 9 AM so our school family can join the parish at daily mass. Thank you for noting the Tuesday morning mass will be at 9 AM starting in September.

Sacrament of Matrimony: Please contact a priest or deacon at least one year before the anticipated date.

Care of the Sick and Elderly: Please inform us of those who are sick, aged, unable to come to church, homebound, hospitalized, or may need the Sacrament of Anointing.

Funerals: Please contact the parish office before scheduling or publishing (generally through a funeral director).

Sponsor Certificates: May be obtained by registered, practicing members of our parish who have received the three sacraments of initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist (and, if married, were married in the Church). Please contact the Parish Office for more details.

Student Cantors for our Day School Masses will still meet on Wednesday right after school until 4 p.m. in the church to prepare for those weekly Masses. Students in grades 5-8 are encouraged to participate starting Wednesday September 13.

Our Adult Choir will resume rehearsal on Tuesday September 5 from 7-9 p.m. in the church, and New Members will be welcomed, especially in the Tenor/Baritone section. High School and College Students are very welcome here! You can join through the month of September, not just the first night, so please consider sharing your time and talent so that this vibrant part of our liturgical celebrations here at our parish continues to grow.

A new Handbell Choir is forming as well, high school students through adults are welcome and an ability to read music, while helpful, is not necessary. Rehearsal will be Monday September 16 from 7-9, come get acquainted with Handbells and how to ring them to add more beauty to our liturgy. The goal will be to ring one Mass per month at 11 a.m. as well as Christmas, Holy Week and Easter Sunday.

Resurrection Catholic Church :

Resurrection Catholic Parish in Solon is beginning L.E.A.F. ministry for those who have a loved one who is incarcerated – Listening, Encouraging, Assisting Families of the incarcerated. It is said that "When a loved one goes to prison, the whole family goes to prison." Family and friends of the incarcerated often experience isolation, shame, and guilt. They have questions about the system and the way it works. They fear for their loved one. L.E.A.F. offers support, comfort, and information to help address the difficulties these families and friends face. The monthly meetings are open to all people irrespective of faith affiliation. They are confidential and there is no fee involved.

As we get ready to begin a new PSR school year, we welcome back our returning families and welcome our new families!

PSR Classes begin:

Sunday, September 10 for High School Monday, September 11 for grades K-6 Sunday, September 17 for grades 7 and 8

Please keep our catechists, children, and their families in your prayers as we begin this new school year!

Special Note:

To receive the sacrament of Eucharist in 2nd grade, two years of regular religious education are required. Therefore, if you have a child entering 1 st grade this school year, please make sure to register him/her in our SJA Parish School of Religion for the 2023-2024 school year.

To receive the sacrament of Confirmation in 8th grade, two years of regular religious education are required. Therefore, if you have a child entering 7th grade this school year, please make sure to register him/her in our SJA Parish School of Religion for the 2023-2024 school year. For Confirmation in 8th grade, in addition to attendance of a regular religious education class, attendance in our supplemental Confirmation preparation program will be required.

If your child attends a Catholic school, they do not need to attend our PSR classes, however, for Confirmation as an 8 th grader, they will need to register for our Confirmation preparation program only.
